Chair Oshiro, Vice Chair Lee, and Committee Members:

Common Cause Hawaii supports HB 545 HD 1, which would establish a system of online voter registration.

This is an important measure to modernize the voter registration process. Our current voter registration method is archaic and burdensome, and unnecessarily excludes many eligible voters from participating in our democracy. In 2001, the National Election Commission chaired by Jimmy Carter and Gerald Ford concluded: "The registration laws in force throughout the United States are among the world's most demanding ... [and are] one reason why voter turnout in the United States is near the bottom of the developed world."

Modernizing voter registration is especially necessary in Hawaii, which has been consistently at or near the bottom of all 50 states in voter turnout. The numbers from the 2010 General Election show that there are 930,624 eligible voters in Hawaii, but only 690,748 registered voters. This leaves an estimated 239,876 potential voters (26% of those eligible) who were not registered at the time of the 2010 General Election.¹

The concept of online voter registration is especially relevant for younger citizens, who are among the least likely to vote. For the generation who grew up with the Internet, doing anything via paper "hard copy" is considered old-fashioned and serves as a reminder that our government is not keeping up with the times.

Dear Chair Oshiro, Vice Chair Lee and Members of the Committee:

I respectfully submit my testimony in support of HB545 HD1.

HB545 HD1 would establish an online system for electronic voter registration, which would allow eligible voters to register entirely online instead of using hard-copy paper forms. This is an important step in making voter registration more modern and accessible. If implemented, we can expect to see an increase in voter registration and turnout¹, and a decrease in monies spent on paper forms¹.

A study done by the Brennan Center for Justice reports three major benefits from online voter registration:

- 1. "Paperless voter registration is cost-effective and saves states millions of dollars each year
- 2. Paperless voter registration is more accurate and reliable than paper forms
- 3. Paperless voter registration increases registration rates."1

Arizona was the first state to implement Online Voter Registration in 2003, and reported an improvement in voter turnout — greatest among **young voters**. In 2008, voters under 34 years old who registered online turned out at 93 percent compared to a 73 percent turnout rate for younger voters who registered "offline."²

By adopting an online voter registration system, and allowing citizens the ability to cast ballots through a secure online voting system, we can not only save printing, postage and paper costs and utilize staff resources more wisely, but we can help increase Hawai'i's low voter turnout.

Please pass HB545 HD1. Mahalo for your time.
