Chair Oshiro, Vice Chair Lee, and Members of the Committee.

The Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism (DBEDT) defers to the Department of Taxation on matters relating to HB 566 HD 1 due to its potential impact on the priorities indicated in the Executive Biennium Budget.

DBEDT has concerns about the reporting requirements outlined in section 2, page 5 of the bill in that information relating to the total number of <u>systems</u> claiming the tax credit by year and technology hasn't been tracked by the Dept of Taxation beginning with tax year 2003 to the present.

It is DBEDT's understanding through the Dept of Taxation that the renewable energy tax credit data has been sorted by industry type to include solar, wind and photovoltaic along with the aggregated number of returns filed, however, DBEDT and DOTAX respectfully submit that data on specific systems installed by year and technology has not been tracked and does not exist.
