RE: H.B. 646: Relating To Traffic Violations

Chair Souki and Members of the Committee:

This measure will require motorcycle and/or moped riders who are cited for having a noisy muffler to sign a written notice to correct the violation, and deliver proof of the correction to the district court. The willful failure to correct the violation, or submit proof of the correction will be punished as a misdemeanor offense.

The Office of the Public Defender opposes H.B. 1435.

This measure requires the district court to receive, monitor and dismiss or report a violation of the written promise to correct the noisy muffler. This will place an undue burden on the court system, and may require the hiring of additional workers or payment of overtime in order to accommodate the increased workload.

The creation of a new criminal offense for failing to submit proof of correction of the violation is extremely harsh, and again, will add to an already overburdened court system. We suggest that section (f) on page two of this measure be stricken, or amended by replacing the word "misdemeanor" to "violation."

It was because my motorcycle was as quiet as can be, with it's stock exhaust pipes (unfortunately still quiet, even when revving the motor). The very next day, I returned back to the dealership and told them about my close encounter. Since this incident I have had loud exhaust pipes installed, and it has prevented MANY close-calls from occuring. Automobile drivers HEAR ME, and are aware of my presence, before they cross lanes into me.

Please do not take this security measure away from single working moms, like myself, who rely so much on my economical way of transportation, just to be able to put some food on the table for my family.

In Opposition of HB 646, Relating to Traffic Violations

Chair Souki, Vice Chair Ishiyama & Committee Members:

On behalf of the Order of the Phoenix, MC, we strongly urge you to oppose HB 646, which does more than just "prohibits motor vehicle mufflers from emitting a noise level above 95 decibels, and authorizes law enforcement officers to issue traffic citations for violations that are correctable." Additionally, current statutes under Chapter 291 are already in place to curtail excessive noise emission, and should be enforced rather than attempt to serve the public through additional statutes.

Passage of HB 646, though possibly well intended will only serve to:

- Increase administrative burden and costs to not only vehicle owners but our state and counties;
- Discriminate between two-wheel and other highway vehicles (see HRS 291-24(b));
- Inhibit commerce within this state; and
- Cause additional enforcement issues rather than enforce the laws against the culprits.

Therefore, we urge you to encourage better enforcement of existing statutes versus creating additional statutes. Mahalo.

- 1) Requiring the officer on scene to be the " calibrated ear" to judge whether to ticket or not, will result in many additinal court hours. Defendent's will challenge. Additional throughput for the courts. Judge workload will substantially increase.
- 2) Requiring all ticketed Motor Vehicle (MV) operators to replace exhaust with a muffler to get under 95 decibels per the draft bill will cause excessive undue financial hardship on existing motorcycle drivers. There is not enough muffler systems on island to purchase within 30 days to get within Bill 646 standards, if enacted.
- 3) Bill 646's initial draft was targeted at Motorcycles/Mopeds. Stiking that and adding " Motor Vehicle" does not change the intention of this bill. It still is targeted at motorcyclists. The sea of lawyers are out there will quickly see this " discriminatory Bill" attempting to " profile" motorcycle riders and target them specifically.
- 4) This Bill being introduced appears to be attempting to " slide in under the radar". It needs to be publicly introduced for debate.

Street Bikers United Hawaii supports current muffler law. Noise complaints should be solved by enforcement of existing law, not creation of new law.

Current Muffler Law in Hawaii:

§291-24 Motorcycles and mopeds, noisy mufflers; penalty. (a) Every motorcycle and moped moving under its own power on a public highway shall at all times be equipped with a muffler in constant operation to prevent any excessive or unusual noise and no such muffler or exhaust system shall be equipped with a cutout, bypass, or similar device. No person shall modify the exhaust system of a motorcycle or a moped in a manner which will amplify or increase the noise emitted by the motor of such motorcycle or moped above that emitted by the muffler originally installed on the motorcycle or moped except a motorcycle or moped that:

- (1) Has three wheels;
- (2) Is powered by an electric motor;
- (3) Has a full body enclosed cab; and
- (4) Has a seat belt assembly or a child restraint system for the driver and passenger; shall not be required to be equipped with a muffler.
- (b) As used in this section, "muffler" means a device consisting of a series of chambers or baffle plates, or other mechanical design, for the purpose of receiving exhaust gas from the engine of the motorcycle or moped, and being effective in reducing noise.
- (c) Whoever violates this section shall be fined not more than \$100. [L 1949, c 21, §1; RL 1955, §311-27; HRS §291-24; am L 1978, c 222, §7; am L 1986, c 189, §1; am L 1994, c 120, §4]
- [§291-24.5] Motor vehicle muffler. (a) No person shall use on a public highway, sell, alter or install a muffler which will noticeably increase the noise emitted by a motor vehicle above that emitted by the vehicle as equipped from the factory.
- (b) Any violation of this section shall constitute a violation and shall be enforceable by police officers. The fine for this violation shall be not less than \$25 nor more than \$250 for each separate offense. Any person who violates the provisions of this section may be issued a summons or citation for such violation. [L 1977, c 79, §1]
- §291-22 Regulation of exhaust pipe and muffler. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive upon the public highways any motor scooter, as defined in section 286-2, the exhaust pipe or muffler of which has been so changed from the factory design as to increase the volume or audibility of the explosions within the motor thereof. [L 1941, c 140, §2; RL 1945, §11718; RL 1955, §311-24; HRS §291-22; am L 1979, c 105, §28]

Deficiencies of recently proposed muffler bills:

Bills calling for specific decibel limits fail to consider the unintended consequences. Already overburdened police must be trained and certified in the use of decibel meters. Decibel meters must be maintained and calibrated for use as evidence in court. HPD has testified against bills calling for specific decibel limits for these reasons. Also, decibel limits set specifically for two-wheeled vehicles are discriminatory. Other vehicles and equipment often make as much or more noise.

Bills calling for "criminalization", felony penalties, and vehicle impoundment are over the top. Vehicle equipment violations should be fix-it tickets. People disturbing the peace may deserve a fine but are not felons. Bills calling for motorcycle impound lots grossly underestimate the costs of same.

Exhaust inspection is already part of the yearly inspection process. Exhaust pipes are checked for sound deadening baffles. Straight (un-baffled) pipes do not pass. The problem with adding more requirements to a yearly inspection is that a yearly inspection only determines compliance on one day of the year. Pipes can be changed after inspection. Also, with so many makes and models, it is impossible for inspectors to know for sure what is original, stock equipment. Original, stock equipment is often no longer available.

Bills calling for EPA labels on pipes would make currently legally registered and inspected motorcycles illegal, constituting a taking of millions of dollars of citizens' property since custom and hand-built motorcycles with "one-off" custom exhausts cannot get such labels. Additional repercussions would include the closing of custom motorcycle and exhaust shops in Hawaii and the laying off of their employees. Bills requiring EPA labels only for two-wheeled vehicles are discriminatory when not requiring EPA labels for all vehicles.

I am writing this letter apposing Bill HB646, requiring police officers to determine 95dBs from a vehicles muffler. I live on Ward Avenue, one of the busiest roads in Hawaii. My home faces Ward Avenue, which makes it difficult, at times, to sleep when a big-rig or uncapped moped comes flying down Ward Ave. at 4:30 in the morning. I've been woken up in the middle of the night by loud car stereos booming so loud that I can still hear it a half a mile down the road. Our police officers can't even enforce Honolulu's Boom-Box Law. They are now required to cite people who are using their cell phones while operating a vehicle and it seems like every other driver I watch go down Ward Ave is still using their phones.

I would also like to know how they (HPD) intend to determine what the required sound level is to a large semi truck or the sound of a modified scooter? How will HPD determine what is an acceptable level just by listening to a motorcycle at idling speed?

Speaking from experience as I am privileged enough to hear some of the loudest vehicles come speeding down my street. I've listened to everything from souped-up Chevy's to little Toyota's with actual train horns blasting from their grill and I fail to see how this can be regulated by our police officers who are already inundated with more and more new laws, just because a small minority of people who seem to think that this will stop the noise.

I am an avid motorcyclist and understand how people feel about those obnoxious riders who just can't control the throttle on their Harleys or chopper. This however can be enforced with current laws such as the "Exhibition of Speed" rule. I have aftermarket exhaust pipes on my motorcycle and it has saved me from negligent drivers who are not paying attention when they are changing lanes. Had they not heard the sound of my exhaust they would have continued changing lanes, colliding into us, causing bodily injury or even death.

I do not condone the abuse of these exhaust systems but to make our law enforcement officers try and determine what the proper noise level is for the guy on his Harley is absurd when our own C&C buses are just as loud if not louder.

Wyman Chang 920 Ward Ave. Honolulu, HI 96814 As a long time motorcycle rider, who uses his motorcycle daily to commute to work, I absolutely oppose the muffler bill. I do so for several reasons.

One, 'loud pipes saves lives'. I commuted for several years on one of the most congested freeways in the country, the I-405 in Southern California. When using the stock mufflers, I would often be cut off by four wheel vehicle drivers who did not see me in the lane. Once I installed the legal louder pipes (not extension but attached to the manifold), the louder sound allowed four wheel vehicle drivers to know that I was near them and become aware. Now living in Honolulu, I found that the H-1 and connecting freeways are also extremely busy with similar safety concerns as I had seen in the mainland. four wheel drivers do not pay attention to motorcycles!

Two, with almost one million people on the island, HPD has more important crimes to handle than loud motorcycle pipes. The families of myself and my wife include both active and retired police officers (HPD and LAPD). The common theme from all of them is drugs, gangs and guns. How much of the officers' time are you willing to sacrifice to pursue loud motorcycle pipes? Does the City and State have enough revenue to add police officers to pursue these 'loud pipe criminals'?

Three, consider that motor scooters and other similar two wheeled vehicles. Neither the vehicle nor the operator are required to be licensed. Many are extremely loud and are operated in mainly residential areas. Many of the operators are young and do not use them safely. I believe that enforcement money would be better spent (and also revenue opportunity) requiring that all motorized vehicles used on the public streets, as well as the riders, be required to be licensed, or at least permitted. Other states already require this.

I believe that many of the complaints are coming from the Waikiki area. The many large buildings concentrated in the area causes echoing of the sound of the pipes among the buildings. I find it highly unfair to penalize the many motorcycle riders in Oahu, who ride in a safe and conscientious manner, for the few who gun their motors, at night, when riding through the Waikiki area.

I greatly appreciate your consideration of my statement of opposition to the proposed bill HB 646.

I support the current muffler law. <u>I STRONGLY OPPOSE HB 646</u>, and any other proposed bill to change current muffler law. Noise complaints should be solved by enforcement of existing law, not creation of new laws.

Bills calling for specific decibel limits fail to consider the unintended consequences. Already overburdened police must be trained and certified in the use of decibel meters. Decibel meters must be maintained and calibrated for use as evidence in court. HPD has testified against bills calling for specific decibel limits for these reasons. Also, decibel limits set specifically for two-wheeled vehicles are discriminatory. Other vehicles and equipment often make as much or more noise, even emergency service vehicles, but let us not pretend that this bill is targeted at anyone other than motorcyclists. In addition, my motorcycle was assembled as original custom equipment from Harley Davidson, but under HB646 I may be held responsible for the OEM provided equipment.

Bills calling for "criminalization", felony penalties, and vehicle impoundment are over the top. Vehicle equipment violations should be fix-it tickets. People disturbing the peace may deserve a fine but are not felons. Bills calling for motorcycle impound lots grossly underestimate the costs of same. Nor do they take into account litigation costs to the state, city and/or county brought about by the proposed bill.

Exhaust inspection is already part of the yearly inspection process. Exhaust pipes are checked for sound deadening baffles. Straight (un-baffled) pipes do not pass. Also, with so many makes and models, it is impossible for inspectors to know for sure what is original, stock equipment. Original, stock equipment is often no longer available in some cases, and in most cases it takes more than 30 days to have items shipped from the mainland. I recently ordered a small item that is a regularly stocked/shipped item from a motorcycle dealership, and it took 34 days to arrive. This small item was included in their "regular" shipment...so a proposed 30-day term to correct a violation with stock parts is disingenuous at best when discussing OEM exhausts and motorcycles.

Bills calling for EPA labels on pipes would make current legally registered and inspected motorcycles illegal, constituting a "taking" millions of dollars of citizens' private property – since custom and handbuilt motorcycles with "one-off" custom exhausts cannot get such labels. Additional repercussions would include the closing of custom motorcycle and exhaust shops in Hawaii and the laying off of their employees. Bills requiring EPA labels only for two-wheeled vehicles are discriminatory when not requiring EPA labels for all vehicles.

Proposed language in the bill will open the state, as well as the City & County of Honolulu to litigation. Does the Honolulu Police Department have decibel meters, are they calibrated correctly, and are the officers properly trained in their use? I can guarantee that receiving a violation notice from a police officer because "the officer thinks," or "it appears to him/her" that a violation may have occurred (without indisputable proof as provided by a calibrated and properly used decibel meter), that the cost of litigation alone for multiple tickets will shutdown an already cash strapped local and state government.

Furthermore, allowing the ticketing after "other law enforcement actions" (again as quoted from the bill language) could also result in litigation. Imagine that "other law enforcement action" was a stop for

being one (1) mile over the speed limit with intent to harass a motorcyclist, or any other type of vehicle driver for that matter. The ambulance chasers would be lining up left and right to take those cases.

Maybe it is finally time to apply common sense and quit targeting – openly or otherwise – those of us that own a mode of transportation that uses less fuel and gets better gas mileage, takes up less space, and does less damage to our roads and environment.

I hope you, our legislature, above all others, can find that common sense and defeat this bill and any future bills of this nature.
