Title of Bill:

HB 0953,HD2(HSCR882) RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Purpose of Bill:

Changes the salary cap for the deputy superintendent, assistant superintendents, and complex area superintendents from eighty percent of the superintendent's salary to the superintendent's salary. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB953 HD2) (\$)

Department's Position:

The Department supports HB 0953, HD2 (HSCR882), which amends the salary caps set by statute for the deputy superintendent, assistant superintendents, and complex area superintendents.

- This bill will provide the flexibility needed to recruit the most qualified
 individuals for leadership positions within the Department of
 Education. Currently there is instability in key leadership positions
 because two of five assistant superintendents and two of fifteen
 complex area superintendents are acting, and another complex area
 superintendent position will be vacated shortly.
- The superintendent's salary is currently capped at \$150,000, while
 the salaries of the deputy superintendent, assistant
 superintendents, and complex area superintendents cannot exceed
 80% of the superintendent's salary, or no more than \$120,000.
- Raising the cap on salaries of the department's leadership positions
 will help the superintendent recruit both internally and externally by
 giving principals and other employees added incentive to apply, and
 by attracting highly qualified external candidates.
