The Attitudes of Hawaii Consumers Toward Genetically Modified Fruit

Introduction

Papaya and other fruit play an important role in Hawaii's agricultural sector. The 2003 farm value of pineapple, papaya, banana, avocado and other fruits in Hawaii totaled \$129.7 million, up three percent from 2002. Fresh fruit accounted for 96 percent of the total value, with exports accounting for 46 percent of the fresh fruit sold. Fresh papaya production totaled 40.8 million pounds in 2003, a four percent drop from 2002, which is the second year a decrease was recorded. As of August 2002, Hawaii's total papaya acreage was estimated at 2,145 acres, a 21 percent decrease compared to the previous year. Harvested acreage of papaya across the state decreased 24 percent from 2002 to 2003. The Big Island's 122 papaya farms accounted for 90 percent of the state's total acreage with growers planting mainly Rainbow and Kapoho varieties (United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), 2003).

A large majority of the papayas in Hawaii are produced with genetically modified (GM) papaya seed that is resistant to the ringspot virus. According to the USDA, 2006, the GM variety Rainbow, which is resistant to Papaya Ringspot Virus (PRV), accounted for 53 percent of the total acres in 2005, up one percent from 2004. The Kapoho variety was the standard for the papaya industry for many years, however, Kapoho is susceptible to PRV.

No federal guidelines currently require labeling of genetically modified organisms (GMO) for US marketing channels. Only organic foods are required to be free of GMO, although GMO free labels may be used by a retailer or wholesaler as part of their individual marketing strategy. US labeling requirements may affect the exports of US fruit since international markets may demand that GMO products be labeled or may not accept them at all.

According to Pesante (2003), Hawaii has been losing market share in the Japanese papaya market to the Philippines. In 2002, the Philippines had 56 percent of the market, while Hawaii had 43 percent. The competitive disadvantage of Hawaiian papayas may stem from Hawaii's distance from the distance from Japan, the higher relative price of Hawaiian papaya, and a limited supply of non-GMO papayas from Hawaii. Papayas from the Philippines are roughly half the price of Hawaiian papayas, and the distance between the two countries is shorter, resulting in fresher, less damaged fruit. The U.S. government is making efforts to persuade the Japanese government to allow the importation of GMO-papayas. As of May 2003, the Japan Department of Agriculture has approved this measure, but Japan's Ministry of Health, Labour & Welfare is still examining the issue.

Research indicates that consumers in Europe and Japan are concerned about food products made with GMO. In 2002, Hirohisa, et al. (2002) examined Japanese consumers' attitudes towards product made from GMO. They found that 69 percent of those surveyed felt that these products posed health risks, 38 percent felt they posed environmental risks, 60 percent were concerned about food allergies, and 60 percent had a fear of an unknown new disease. When asked whether they would consume GMO if they were safe, 32 percent would not, 32 percent still feared health risks, 31 percent did

not support the idea of genetically modifying any organism, and 30 percent were uneasy about the concept of GMO. More than 90 percent of those surveyed supported the labeling of GMO, 68 percent such labeling was needed, and 50 percent felt that not labeling GMO was a violation of the consumer's rights. Bredahl (1999) surveyed the consumers in Denmark, Germany, the United Kingdom, and Italy. Respondents generally did not prefer to use GMO products. Genetic modification was associated with negative consequences, such as damage to the environment and moral problems. Positive attributes were noted but were not enough to overcome negative associations.

Some research that examines US consumer attitudes toward GMO has also been competed. Baker and Burnham (2001) concluded that women tended to be more concerned with food safety than men and that consumers with a relatively high knowledge of biotech were more likely to accept GMO products. Lusk and Sullivan (2002) completed a study of consumer attitudes toward GMO products in Mississippi and found more than 70 percent believed that GM foods were acceptable. They also indicated that consumers have concerns about adverse health effects from GM products. The majority thought they were "somewhat knowledgeable" while 3 percent believed they were "very knowledgeable." Older consumers with relatively high incomes and more education were more positive about GM food. Hossein et al. (2003) found that 74 percent of respondents to a survey approve of the use of genetic modification of fruits and vegetables if the price is lower. They concluded that the respondent's level of knowledge about biotechnology was found to significantly affect approval and acceptance of GMO products. Consumers who check labels when shopping were less likely to accept genetically modified foods. Kaneko and Chern (2003) found similar results based on a survey of US mainland consumers. They found that 50-60 percent of the respondents were somewhat informed about GMO, and 50 percent thought that GMO products pose a risk to human health. Religious or ethical concerns about GMO were cited as an important for 40 percent of the respondents, while 80 percent felt that products containing GMO should be labeled. Younger consumers were more likely to accept GMO. Ferguson et al. (2002) surveyed Hawaii residents about their opinions of GMO and found that respondents rated GMO as more favorable if the GMO application contributed to increased environmental quality, a lowered cost of production, increased nutritional value or increased disease resistance. They also found respondents' opinions varied depending on their age, gender, education, ethnicity, county and income.

Given that Hawaii's papaya industry, which is showing signs of contraction, relies heavily upon GMO and that no specific information is available about the preferences Hawaii consumers toward GM fruit, the paper presents the results of a survey of Hawaii residents about their attitude toward GMO fruit. The results can be utilized to assess the present level of consumers' knowledge about the GMO fruit, and to design appropriate recommendations for policy makers.

A telephone survey (see Appendix I) was conducted from February to June 2006. Five hundred thirty eight residents were selected at random from the telephone directories of all the Hawaiian Islands. If the resident declined to participate, another was selected. The questionnaire asked about the respondent's opinions on health, safety and allergies,

willingness to consume, willingness to purchase if genetic modification reduced the need for pesticides, willingness to purchase if GM fruits are as nutritious as non-genetically modified fruits, willingness to purchase if GMO cost ten percent more or cost ten percent less, consumer opinion about labeling the fruits, and demographic characteristics of the consumers. Chi-Square was used to test for significant differences in the results and the confidence level is 95 percent, leaving a five percent chance of error. While 538 people responded to the survey, not all respondents answered every question.

As indicated in Table 1, the survey represented a cross section of Hawaii residents. The respondents' characteristics generally represent the overall characteristics of the State's general population, although the State's urban population is generally larger than the urban population of the sample. It may be that respondents' definition of rural and urban are not the same as the US Census definition.




Figure 1: Do you Feel will Informed about GM Food

Eight percent of the respondents indicated that they are well informed about GM food products, 28 percent indicated they are somewhat informed, 31 percent very little and 33 percent not at all (Figure 1).





Figure 2: True or False Question on Knowledge of GMO Fruits

In order to determine if respondents were indeed knowledgeable about GMO, three questions were included on the questionnaire that required a true, false, or don't know answer. The first question asked whether or not GM fruit contain modified genes, which is true. As Figure 2 indicates, 49 percent if respondents answered it correctly, 17 percent answered it incorrectly, and 34 percent did not know the answer. The second question asked whether non-GM fruits do not contain modified genes, which is false. Thirty-five percent answered it correctly and 65 percent answered it incorrectly. The third question asked whether eating GMO fruit alters a person's genes, which is a question that cannot be answered at this point in time. Thirty-five percent answered it correctly and the remaining 65 percent did not. Thus, it appears that respondents were relatively accurate in their self-assessments about their knowledge of GMO

Respondents lack knowledge about GMO and therefore, have misconceptions. More consumer education is needed to ensure that consumers have a thorough understanding of GMO and the role they can and do play in the agricultural sector. This type of education is likely to increase the consumer acceptance of GMO products or, at the least, to minimize misconceptions.

With respect to their perceptions about the safety of GMO fruit, respondents were equally divided about the safety of GMO. Thirty -four percent thought they were extremely risky or somewhat risky and 36 percent believed they were extremely safe or somewhat safe to eat.



With respect to their willingness consume GMO fruits, 51 percent of the consumers were extremely willing or somewhat willing to consume the product, and 32 percent were extremely unwilling or somewhat unwilling (see Figure 4). If the GMO fruit production reduces the amount of pesticide used in its production, 68 percent of the respondents indicated they are extremely willing or somewhat willing to consume the fruit compared to 21 percent who are unwilling or extremely unwilling. If the GMO fruit production causes allergic reactions for some people, 53 percent of the respondents indicated they are extremely unwilling or somewhat unwilling to consume the fruits compared to 33 percent who are willing or extremely willing. With respect to nutritional value of GMO fruit as compared to as non-GMO fruits, 65 percent of the respondents indicated they are extremely willing or somewhat willing to consume the fruits compared to 21 percent who are unwilling or extremely unwilling to consume the fruits.

If the GMO fruit production prices are higher than non-GMO fruit, 31 percent of respondent indicated they are extremely unwilling or somewhat unwilling to consume the fruit as compared to 53 percent who are unwilling or extremely unwilling to consume the fruits. If the GMO price is lower, 63 percent of respondents indicated they are extremely willing or somewhat willing to consume the fruits compared to 22 percent who are unwilling or extremely unwilling to consume the fruit.





Figure 5: Respondents Opinion on Ethics

Respondents were asked how important are ethical or religious concerns when they decided whether or not to consume GMO fruits. As Figure 5 indicates, 18 percent considered it very important, as compared to 33 percent who did not consider it to be important. As far as the importance of labeling GMO fruit, a large percentage, 71 percent, of the respondents considered it very important as compared to 5 percent who said it was not important.

This survey provides important information about respondents' knowledge about GMO and attitudes toward labeling GMO. A cross tabulation between respondents who know about GMO and their attitudes toward labeling in Figure 6 found a significant relationship between these two variables. Among those that indicated that they are well


informed about the GMO, 49 percent supported labeling as compared to 71 percent who felt they were somewhat informed, 74 percent for these who indicated they are little informed and 75 percent among those who are not informed at all.

With respect to what methods should policy makers adopt in dealing the labeling (see Figure 7), 38 percent of the well-informed respondents supporting labeling and wanted the labeling for both GMO and non-GMO, 26 percent want it for GMO only. In the case of uninformed respondents who wanted labeling, 44 percent wanted it for both GMO and non-GMO and 42 percent wanted labeling for GMO alone.




Figure 8: Gender and Labeling




Figure 9: Gender and Labeling Policy Education

As shown in Figure 8, the gender of the respondent was also significantly related their attitude toward labeling. Eighty percent of the females want the GM fruits to be labeled as compared to 61 percent of male respondents. At the same time, Figure 9 shows that 46 percent of the female respondents want the GMO labeling to be mandatory for all food products, compared to 40 percent of male respondents

Education was divided into four categories: those with some high school, high school graduate, college graduate, and some post-graduate college. A positive correlation exists between the educational level of the respondent and their support for mandatory labeling.




Figure 10: Education and Attitude toward Labeling

As Figure 10 indicates, 63 percent of the respondents with some high school want the mandatory GMO labeling for all food products, compared to 81 percent of respondent that are high school graduate, 84 percent for college graduates, and 88 percent for those with some post-graduate college.




Figure 11: Educational Levels and Type of labeling Policy




Figure 12: Labeling and Income Levels




Figure 13: Income and Type of labeling Policy

The majority of the respondents feel labeling is very important (see Figure 12). Households that earn less than \$15,000 year feel labeling is less important than do households from the other income categories. However, the differences that were found between household income levels are not significant. As Figure 13 indicates, respondents

with lower income level are more supportive of *mandatory* labeling, although this result is not significant.

Discussion and Conclusion

A telephone survey was conducted to determine the attitude of Hawaii residents toward GMO fruits. Residents were selected at random from the telephone directories of all the Hawaiian Islands. The questionnaire asked about the respondent's opinions on health safety and allergies, willingness to consume, willingness to purchase if genetic modification reduced the amount of pesticides, willingness to purchase if genetically modified fruits are as nutritious as non-genetically modified fruits,

In general, respondents are not well informed about the GM food products and they are aware that they lack knowledge. Many are wary of consuming GMO because they feel they may be unsafe. This lack of knowledge about how GMO are scientifically produced may cause misconceptions. A strategic educational plan is needed plan to educate the consumers about GMO. The benefits of GMO for specific products, such as reductions in pesticide use, reductions in post harvesting losses, and improved nutritional value should be included. These benefits are very important market attributes that influence the consumer's decision making.

At the same time, educational materials should be developed to explain the risk of GMO pose the environment and to human health. This will increase consumer acceptance and minimize misconceptions about the GMO in food chain. Before introducing new GMO products, information about their benefit over the traditional varieties should be made known to the consumers.

The respondents strongly believe that GMO fruits should be labeled. Mandatory labeling of GMO appear to be an idea whose time has come. The cost of labeling will become a production cost and likely will not result a large price increase for consumers.

RE: HCR178/HR154 REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO REPORT ON THE FEASIBILITY OF IMPLEMENTING A LABELING SYSTEM FOR GENETICALLY ENGINEERED FOODS

Chair Yamane and Members of the Committee:

MCFB on behalf of our commercial farm and ranch families and organizations is <u>strongly opposed</u> to HCR178 and HR154 requesting the Department of Health to report on the feasibility of implementing a labeling system for genetically engineered foods.

MCFB strongly believes that genetic engineering is an important option for our farmers to grow agricultural crops to increase our local self sufficiency. Those who see value in identifying non-GM foods can do so and find a market advantage from the population that prefers such products.

Contrary to the preamble, GM foods are tested extensively and for many years before becoming available in the marketplace. Most products sold undergo much less by FDA, EPA or other regulatory agencies, yet are deemed safe. GM's rapidity in marketshare is due to the advantages the products provide.

This year, agencies such as the Department of Health is under SEVERE budgetary constraints. This is an unfunded mandate. Last year there was an outcry about the lack of inspections of restaurants by DOH. This measure will probably end in that branch of the agency which has been proven to be understaffed and underbudgeted.

Critical safety concerns should be addressed. This is NOT one of them. During this year of difficult budget decisions, measures such as this should not take precedence over critical duties by the department. This unfunded mandate will cost dollars and hours.

We respectfully request that this measure be held. Please do not impose an unfunded mandate on the Department of Health. Thank you for this opportunity to provide our opinion on this matter.

RE: HCR 178 and HR154 - OPPOSE

Dear Chairman Yamane and Members of the Committee:

The Grocery Manufacturers Association¹ (GMA) and its more than three hundred members respectfully oppose HCR 178 and HR 154. As drafted, these measures direct the Department of Health to report to the Legislature on the feasibility of implementing a labeling system for food products that contain genetically engineered material. We oppose these measures because such a mandate presupposes an issue with food safety and does everything to discourage investment in science and technology that could bring about more efficient operations and better, more nutritious foods.

Mandatory labeling of food products containing genetically engineered ingredients are misguided and unnecessary. The United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA) already regulates the introduction of and labeling of biotech foods. Producers are legally responsible to the FDA for the safety and wholesomeness of any food product placed on the market and all foods, regardless of whether they are produced using biotechnology or not, are regulated for their individual safety, toxicity and the presence of allergens.

Furthermore, after decades of scientific review, the FDA determined that genetically enhanced foods are equivalent to foods developed through crossbreeding, and other traditional methods. Thus, compulsory state labeling provides no additional significant or useful information to consumers. In fact,

research shows that mandatory labeling of biotechnology products has the negative impact of misleading consumers to believe foods derived from biotechnology are harmful when the best current scientific evidence indicates, they are not.


GMA supports a consumer's right to obtain important information about the health and safety of food products and we are committed to informing consumers about modern biotechnology. GMA member companies have made information available through consumer "1-800" numbers, supermarket brochures and were instrumental in developing the Alliance for Better Foods which has a website where consumers can obtain comprehensive information about food biotechnology.

Simply put, labeling food derived through biotechnology goes beyond educating the consumer about food safety -- it is designed to require "warning labels" that focus upon the process by which a food was produced. Requiring warning labels for these products will create a false impression that there are dangers associated with consumption of such products or that their nutritional value has been diminished. Furthermore, mandatory labels for these products would present a tremendous and costly enforcement problem to the state and result in huge costs to food processors, retailers and ultimately, consumers, while producing absolutely no benefit.

For these reasons, GMA respectfully opposes HCR 178 and HR 154.


My name is Alicia Maluafiti, Executive Director of the Hawaii Crop Improvement Association, a nonprofit trade association representing the seed industry in Hawaii. HCIA strongly opposes HCR 178 and HR 154.

Labeling Should Follow Established Federal Guidelines

State-based labeling requirements that differ from previously established, stringently enforced federal guidelines, provide no value for consumers and only serve to disparage foods improved by biotechnology. The U.S. Food & Drug Administration's labeling guidance requires that a food label must reveal all *material* facts about that food. They follow a stringent science-based approach in developing this guidance and have decided biotech foods do not inherently "present any different or greater safety concern than foods developed by [conventional methods]." FDA uses the principal of "substantial equivalence" — focusing on the final product, not the process used to develop a food product, to determine how it should be labeled. In addition, mandatory labeling requirements that vary from state-to-state would not only conflict with FDA guidelines, but would be costly to consumers, retailers and farmers.

Consumers Already Have Choices

Today – consumers enjoy a variety of food choices and their choices of what to eat or not eat are based on a variety of personal reasons. Those that conform to the regulations of the Jewish faith choose to eat Kosher foods because they avoid ingredients derived from non-kosher animals or from kosher animals that were not properly slaughtered. These foods are appropriately labeled – at the request of those eating those foods – "Kosher." Vegans and vegetarians make nutritional choices for a variety of reasons that are void of meat and meat by-products. People who choose to NOT eat food created through biotechnology or that utilize biotech ingredients – which includes 70 percent of products sold in the supermarket – choose foods that are already appropriately labeled "organic" or "all natural" or "Non-GMO." Forcing a labeling system on GE foods only in Hawaii is simply unnecessary and would have economic consequences for the entire state.

Biotechnology Provides Solutions to World Challenges

While we don't advocate the tools of biotechnology to solve <u>all</u> our societal problems, it is clear – after almost 20 years of research – that the science is being used successfully and continues to be embraced throughout the world.

- Genetic engineering may help to fight banana disease in Uganda, the world's second largest producer of the crop. Thirty percent of Uganda's banana crop has been infected with the disease.
- Scientists from the Bangladesh are testing zinc-rich rice varieties with the goal
 of mass producing a GE crop within the next five years. Farmers in field trials
 are producing rice with high zinc content to control abnormalities like
 stunting, poor immune response and pregnancy complications which can
 result from too little iron.
- African farmers had low yields for crops such as sorghum and cassava, but the adoption of biotech sorghum has tripled yields and genetic research helps prevent the devastation of cassava from disease.
- Dr. Yuma, a professor and founder of the African Centre for Technology Studies, the first African NGO dedicated to promoting science and technology methods for sustainable development, currently directs the Agricultural Innovation Project at Harvard which is funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. He reports that the use of genetically modified BT corn and cotton has reduced pesticide use and increased crop yields in Burkina Faso, South Africa, and Egypt.

By now, the major concerns, both those with some basis in science and some without, have hugely been laid to rest, and it is time to get on with reality. Facing a \$1.2 billion dollar deficit, there is absolutely no justifiable reason for the state to waste valuable resources on what amounts to a witch-hunt by a vocal minority opposed to biotechnology.

TESTIMONY ON HCR 178 / HR 154 REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO REPORT ON THE FEASIBILITY OF IMPLEMENTING A LABELING SYSTEM FOR GENETICALLY ENGINEERED CROPS

Chair Yamane and committee members:

My name is Fred Perlak, Vice President of Research and Business Operations for Monsanto Hawaii. We <u>strongly oppose</u> HCR 178 / HR 154 that requests the Dept. of Health to do a feasibility study on a labeling system for genetic engineered crops.

The requirement to label a genetically modified crop makes a false or negative assumption that a genetically engineered crop is somehow inferior to conventional or organic crops. Federal research and regulatory agencies have conducted years of studies that show no health or safety concerns that would call for the labeling of genetically modified crops. Quite the contrary, this research has found crops currently available from biotechnology to be as safe as those produced via other more conventional methods.

Federal law already requires accurate food labeling that provides information relevant to health, safety and nutrition of all food products sold in the United States. The FDA establishes uniform labeling requirements to be consistent with consumer protection and commerce on a nation wide basis. It will be difficult and nearly impossible for State and Federal regulators to inspect and test all products being sold or distributed in the State. Approximately 85% of our food products are imported into the State.

Hawaii's farming community, specifically the papaya farmers, will also be placed at a competitive disadvantage to imported products. The papaya industry relied on this technology to saved the industry from complete devastation due to the papaya ringspot virus. This labeling system will cause an economic hardship on our local farmers, wholesalers, and retailers. The State will need to seek additional funding to train and hire additional inspectors and specialists.

As a citizen concerned about the health, environmental, ethical, and socio-economic hazards of Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs) and industrial-scale factory farms or CAFOs (Confined Animal Feeding Operations), I feel strongly that consumers have an inalienable right to know whether the food we are purchasing likely contains GM ingredients or comes from animals confined in CAFOs.

Up to 90% of U.S. soybeans, corn, cotton, canola, and sugar beets are now genetically engineered and routinely inserted into human and animal foods with no labels or safety testing.

Approximately 80% of current grocery food items contain GMOs; while according to U.S. Department of Agriculture statistics, the majority of beef, pork, poultry, dairy, and eggs come from CAFOs.

Considering the growing concern over GMOs and CAFOs, all non-organic food products containing soy, corn, cottonseed oil, canola, sugar beets or GM growth hormones should be clearly identified with a label or shelf sign that says " May Contain GMOs" and all meat, dairy, and eggs that come from CAFOs should be identified with a label or shelf sign that says " CAFO".

The position of the US government has been that GMOs are substantially equivalent to unmodified varities and therefore pose no safety risks, obviating the need for FDA to require labeling.


