REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII SEA GRANT COLLEGE PROGRAM TO REVIEW THE EFFECTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE ON HAWAII'S COASTAL AND MARINE RESOURCES.

STRONGLY SUPPORT WITH AMENDMENT

The Windward Ahupua'a Alliance initially took on climate change issues after returning from an international conference in August, 2005. By the 2008 legislative session, climate change was WAA's #1 priority.

Although legislation was passed in 2009 establishing a Climate Change Task Force, former Governor Linda Lingle did not release its funding so <u>ACT 20 - Special Session 2009</u> expired at the end of 2010. This year, both the *House* & the *Senate* initiated legislation to set up the Task Force again but both folded the concept into the "barrel tax" legislation.

Currently, HB 1019 HD1 SB2 is waiting for a committee report before sending it on for a full vote by the Senate. It will definitely go into at least one round of conference committee discussions.

WAA proposes that <u>HCR 97/HR 89</u> be amended to include requesting that Sea Grant College collaborate with the Climate Change Task Force and a not-yet-established Hawai'i Tourism Authority working group.

WAA also recommends that the Energy and Environmental Protection Committee put in conditional language such as "provided that the Legislature passes and the Governor signs the barrel tax" legislation which include re-establishing & funding the Task Force."
