The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) <u>SUPPORTS</u> SB101, SD1, which exempts the preparation of hand-pounded poi from certain processing requirements and from Department of Health (DOH) regulation regarding food safety. The bill also imposes labeling requirements on hand-pounded poi made outside of certified food processing establishments and authorizes DOH to conduct inspections of hand-pounded poi producer's premises under certain conditions.

Our traditions hold that kalo is the elder sibling of the Native Hawaiian people. Poi, which is made from kalo, is the staple of our traditional diet. While poi mills have provided our communities with poi for many years, the traditional practice of hand-pounding poi is enjoying a powerful resurgence today. We must nurture this movement, as it supports our local agricultural industry, ensures food security and promotes a healthier diet, all while encouraging one of our most important Native Hawaiian cultural practices.

OHA understands and appreciates DOH's sanitation concerns relating to the preparation of pa'i 'ai that will be sold, and we commend DOH for working with the community to find a solution to this important issue. We believe that SB101, SD1, represents a reasonable compromise that allows for hand-pounded pa'i 'ai to be sold; preserves DOH's ability to protect public health; and informs consumers about the product.

Therefore, OHA urges the committee to PASS SB101, SD1. Mahalo for the opportunity to testify.

Aloha mai kakou,

Mahalo nui loa for taking the time to read my testimony in support of SB101. My name is Nick Needle. I'm a student at HPU, and a USCG-licensed boat captain, living and working in Kane'ohe, O'ahu. I urge the House of Representatives to hear SB 101, to legalize the sale of traditional hand-pounded poi to the public. As a consumer, I want my freedom to choose to buy hand-pounded poi. I know from personal experience that hand-pounded poi is a safe and wholesome food product that promotes good health, and there is absolutely no legitimate reason why it should not be made available to the public. And while the State Government prohibits the sale of this healthy, traditional food, it allows for the sale of products known to be dangerous to our health, such as tobacco, alcohol, and fast-food. This situation is backwards and horrendous, and it needs to be fixed.

On a broader level, I believe with the strongest conviction that the sale of hand-pounded poi must be legalized in order to strengthen our local agriculture, economy, and sustainability here in Hawai'i. We are far too dependent on food imports and dangerously vulnerable to the global market and forces beyond our own control. Legalizing hand-pounded poi presents an enormous opportunity for Hawai'i to get out of this situation and reclaim our food sovereignty. If the State legalizes its sale, the demand for taro will go up. This means more support for taro farmers.

More people will have the opportunity to return to the 'aina and take care of it. The Hawai'i State legislature cannot ignore this potential opportunity for agricultural and economic growth.

I can attest to the strong public support backing SB 101. The DOH is now doing the right thing and supporting SB 101. It is time for the State Legislature to do the same. Please support and pass SB 101. Do not let this great opportunity for our community and our 'aina slip away.

Aloha mai kakou,

My name is Daniel Anthony and I support SB101. I pound kalo to feed my wife and three children. If this measure passes I will be able to again be a productive member of society. In 1977 the waiahole poi factory first started by hand pounding of kalo. The DOH stopped them. When I asked why they didn't contest? They said there was not enough awareness or support of issues regarding Hawaiian culture, cultural practice and the importance of both in modern Hawaiian society. In November of 2009 was the first time we were wanted by the DOH. Up until then we openly sold pa'i'ai to the community and had been hired by many large companies in Hawaii. Some of these companies are Shereton Resorts, Outrigger Resorts, Native Hawaiian Chamber of Commerce, Ward Warehouse, Haili's Hawaiian Food and many others. Since the DOH approached me in November of 2009, I stopped expansion of pa'i'ai sales and did education and private functions. In spite of DOH investigation on me, we still worked with countless government groups such as Hawaii Tourism Authority, Native Hawaiian Hospitality Association and University of Hawaii at Manoa, we even pounded kalo at the capitol for Hawaiian Caucus Day. Since October of 2010, I have not sold any pa'i'ai. I do continue to do ku'i'ai education and since October of 2010 I have participated, organized or supplied kalo for at least 20 community kalo pounding workshops.

I could probably go out and get a job. It would not be something I was passionate about and that I was good at. I would have to look for child care for my two young children. This would cause considerable stress on my family's social health, my children would be raised outside of the family and we would be forced to eat poi less, because if we had to pay for poi we could not afford to eat it.

Pounding kalo was a respectable occupation on Oahu until around 1910. In early time of the machine made poi, I have come across articles where Hawaii residents complain that the milled poi does not compare to that of the hand pounded.

Those were different times, with different understandings. We have had over 100 years of no pa'i'ai available to Oahu's residents and it's been over 40 years anywhere in Hawaii that you could not find and purchase pa'i'ai. Don't you think it's been long enough?

I ask you to support this bill, to support what we are all looking to attain, sustainability. If I can feed my family and feed my community through the land we live on and at the same time honor our host culture in a way that brings our most sacred food. Then what do we have to lose?

SB 101 The "right" to pound kalo

This testimony is in support of legalizing pa'i 'ai; or pounding kalo. As a person who has attended kalo pounding session(s) I can honestly say that the process in which the poi pounders are subjected to is thoroughly clean. It is pressure washed after each use and before the use of it again. So basically it is washed twice before being used to pound the kalo.

According to State Constitutional law Native Hawaiians are allowed and should be protected in their ancient customary and traditional practices. Pounding kalo is as traditional as you can get; furthermore the history of the Hawaiian Customs has always involved "cleanliness" especially in dealing with food, childbirth, and death. It is the State's responsibility to ensure the "well-being" of the Native Hawaiian and denying us our basic staple sustenance such as Kalo; is not fulfilling the responsibility of ensuring the perpetuation of the Native Hawaiian people and its traditional and customary practices.

I don't see how this bill has gotten so far because of the "practice" in question; or the sale of pounded kalo without a permit is ludicrous when on television you see rats having buffets in Chinatown; yet that place is still running.

I can say for a fact there are no rats running around the pounding of Kalo. Please uphold the State's responsibility in regards to this matter. It seems that it just boils down to the money issue involved with obtaining a State permit from the health department; when most of Chinatown is infested with rats, it seems like Native Hawaiians are being singled-out in this regard.

So please pass this bill SB 101 so that many Hawaiians and non-Hawaiians may enjoy the freshness and nutrition that stems from eating kalo.

I'm a wife, mother, and educator. The legalization of the commercial sale of pa'i'ai, will provide opportunities for many to live the lifestyle that many would like to. A sustainable and healthy lifestyle!

As a wife and mother, I can testify that all three of my children have had poi and pa'i'ai as their first foods. They are healthy and very active individuals that rarely get sick. My husband, growing up in a kalo farming family himself, continues to ku'i 'ai (pound kalo) regularly to provide for our family and others in need. The high cost of purchasing poi has made our family become dependent on purchasing raw kalo to be cooked and prepared at home. We have also seen how much more "poi" you receive when you make it yourself.

This bill would allow my husband as well as many others to be able to do what they love and make a living doing it!

As an educator, the interest in ku'i 'ai and lo'i kalo farming is in high demand. In one year, my program serviced close to a 1000 people. We purchased 1800 to 2000 pounds of kalo last year to meet the need. This year the demand has doubled, however we are unable to meet the demand due to the lack of kalo being sold in Hawai'i.
