TESTIMONY Nikki Love, Executive Director, Common Cause Hawaii

Chair Hee, Vice Chair Shimabukuro, and Committee Members:

Common Cause Hawaii opposes SB 1195, which proposes to disregard blank votes and overvotes in determining whether a proposed constitutional amendment has been ratified by the electorate.

This bill would make it easier to change the constitution. We believe any changes to the constitution should be done carefully, and there does not seem to be a pressing need to make it easier to ratify constitutional amendments. Instead, those advocating for any future constitutional amendments should make a persuasive case to the public to show up informed and ready to vote.

Disregarding the blank votes and overvotes would change the incentives involved in the public education process. When blank votes and overvotes essentially count as a "no," the proponents of an amendment have a strong incentive to educate the public on their position and encourage the public to cast a "yes" vote. On the other hand, if blank votes and overvotes are disregarded in the tallying, then the proponents would have a lower threshold to reach and therefore would have less incentive to work hard to inform the voters. Given the existing low levels of voter participation, we do not think it is a good idea to change these incentives toward the direction of less education and less mobilization.
