My name is Dr. Cindy Goldstein, representing Pioneer Hi-Bred International, Inc., with facilities on Oahu and Kauai.

Pioneer Hi-Bred strongly supports SB 1209 appropriating funds for the continued operation and maintenance of the east Kauai irrigation system.

Pioneer Hi-Bred International, Inc. produces corn, soybean and sunflower seed crops in Hawaii, with two locations on Kauai. We carry out research and development at our Waimea Research Center and multiply seed at Kekaha Parent Seed to develop new hybrids and varieties that are more productive for farmers in the US and around the world. Pioneer employs approximately 400 people in a wide range of types of jobs on Oahu and Kauai.

Pioneer strongly supports funding for the ongoing operation and maintenance of the East Kauai Irrigation System for the East Kauai Water Users' Cooperative to operate this state-owned irrigation system. Many agriculture operations rely upon water from aging irrigation systems that require substantial maintenance to continue operating. Sufficient water is needed for agricultural operations to continue thriving. The number of farmers on Kauai is increasing and demands for water from the East Kauai Irrigation System for production of fruits, vegetables, herbs, and other agricultural products will only increase.
