### Re: SB 122 SD1- Relating to Naturopathic Physicians

Dear Chair Ige, Vice Chair Kidani and Members of the Committee:

My name is Howard Lee and I am President of the Hawaii Association of Health Plans ("HAHP"). HAHP is a non-profit organization consisting of eight (8) member organizations:

AlohaCare

Hawaii Medical Assurance Association

**HMSA** 

Hawaii-Western Management Group, Inc.

Kaiser Permanente

MDX Hawai'i

University Health Alliance

UnitedHealthcare

Our mission is to promote initiatives aimed at improving the overall health of Hawaii. We are also active participants in the legislative process. Before providing any testimony at a Legislative hearing, all HAHP member organizations must be in unanimous agreement of the statement or position.

HAHP appreciates the opportunity to testify in opposition to SB 122 SD1 which would require health plans include naturopaths in any complementary care riders and set reimbursement rates for these services based on Worker's Compensation statute. HAHP generally opposes legislation considered to be a mandated benefit, whether it be mandating health plans provide coverage for a certain service or to provide certain services rendered by a specific provider type. At this time, most HAHP plans do not provide benefits for the coverage of services provided by naturopaths so mandating that all plans recognize them as PCPs would ultimately cause naturopaths to become a mandated provider type. Naturopathic services are also not required to be provided as basic benefits under the rules of the Hawai'i Prepaid Health Care Council.

We would support requiring the Hawaii State Auditor to perform a study to examine the impacts of including coverage for naturopathic care as required under HRS 23-51. This statute requires that prior to passage of a mandate requiring the coverage for "certain providers of health care services", the Auditor examine the social and financial affects of the mandated coverage. It has come to our attention that the Auditor performed a study on this issue 22 years ago in 1989. It is likely that some things have changed in that time and the provision of updated, relevant information would assist the legislature in determining whether to proceed with this mandate.

It is worthwhile to note that once the Health Insurance Exchange is up and running in 2014, only those services considered to be "essential health benefits" will be required to be covered by qualified health plans. Any services mandated by a state which fall outside of the essential health benefits definition will be the financial liability of the state for those plans providing coverage within the Exchange. While it is unclear at this time

what types of services will and will not be included within the definition, the state needs to be aware that there is a risk of being financially liable for the inclusion of these types of mandates.

Due to the concerns expressed above, we would respectfully request that this measure be held and instead that the Auditor be requested to perform a study on mandating naturopathic services.

### Testimony in Opposition to SB 122 SD1 Relating to Naturopathic physicians

SB 122 SD1 proposes to define coverage for services by a naturopathic physician. Section 4 of the bill amends the definition of child health services to include those provided by a "naturopathic physician". This is inconsistent with the American Academy of Pediatrics Policy Statement entitled "Scope of Practice Issues in the Delivery of Pediatric Health Care." MDs/DOs have significantly longer and more extensive graduate level training in the care of children. For example:

MDs/DOs = Length of graduate level education - 4 years (90 credit hours); Years of residency/fellowship training - 3 years; Total patient care hours required through training - 12,000-16,000 hours.

Naturopaths = Length of graduate level education - 4 years; Years of residency/fellowship training - not required; Total patient care hours required through training - 720 -1,200 hours.

The Hawai'i Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, along with the American Academy of Pediatrics nationally, is concerned about risks to quality and patient safety in the care of children that could result by the passage of this bill.

The Hawai'i Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics strongly opposes the passage of SB 122 SD1 relating to Naturopathic physicians.
