Comments:

I strongly support this bill. Having state run dispensaries (not for profit) will ensure that patients have safe and reliable access to their medicine, allow for quality control so that patients are not getting sicker from smoking moldy cannabis, eliminate/reduce the black market and also reduce underage access to cannabis. Dispensaries should also be encouraged to carry some cannabis strains that are very low in THC but high in CBD. These strains still have anti-inflammatory and pain relieving effects without the " high". I think that these specific strains should be offered tax-free to patients and at a lower cost. This would encourage the majority of patients to rely mostly, if not completely on the low THC strains.

Under the current system patients are allowed to grow for themselves or to designate a " primary caregiver" to grow for them. Many patients are too sick to grow and are then at the mercy of a " caregiver". The patient then has no control over the quality of the medicine they receive nor the consistancy in which they receive it, and a host of other problems. There are many responsible caregivers. There are also some who are not. In those cases the patients are left to suffer with very few alternatives.

We have many visitors to the islands who are medical marijuana patients from other states. There could also be made a provision for these patients to be allowed to access our dispensaries on a limited basis while they are in Hawaii. The current law does not address this situation at all.
