### RE: S.B. 1533, S.D. 1; RELATING TO CRUELTY TO ANIMALS.

Chair Keith-Agaran, Vice-Chair Rhoads, and members of the House Committee on Judiciary, the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the City and County of Honolulu submits the following testimony in support of Senate Bill 1533.

The purpose of S.B. 1533, S.D. 1 is to amend HRS 711-1109(1)(c) to clarify the definition of animal cruelty in the second degree.

The Department agrees that current references to "pests" and "vermin" within HRS 711-1109(1)(c) are very ambiguous for purposes of notice and enforcement, and should be removed to better clarify this law. The Department further agrees that there must be exceptions for accepted forms of "pest control," and believes that the current language of S.B. 1533, S.D. 1 will adequately allow for such activity.

For these reasons, the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the City and County of Honolulu supports Senate Bill 1533, S.D. 1. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this matter.

Chair Keith-Agaran and Members of the Committee:

I am Tim Lyons, Executive Director of the Hawaii Pest Control Association and we have concerns on this bill.

It is our members that are called upon to do structural pest control for pests and other insects around homes and structures. One service that is typically offered is bird control. Another offered infrequently but, nevertheless, is offered by pest control operators is control of mongoose.

In either case, it is typically not our intent to poison or kill these undesirable nuisances but it does happen. The original terms of the bill included "vermin or other pests" however, that has now been changed. Vermin includes animals that directly damage crops and land and there are

some that would carry social parasites and would be considered as undesirable. Pigeons are also typically considered vermin and hotels, particularly in Waikiki, have a huge problem with pigeon control.

Based on the above, we would, one, request a return to the original language and two, request additional language which specifically excludes the activities undertaken by licensed pest control operators who are authorized and licensed under Chapter 460J HRS.
