SB 249 SD2 HD1 Making an Appropriation to the Department of Agriculture

Aloha Chair Oshiro, Vice Chair Lee, and Members of the Committee:

The Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation, representing farmers and ranchers throughout the islands, supports this bill because it will help assure that the Hawaii Livestock Cooperative facility remains available to address the food needs of the islands. We defer to the appropriate authorities regarding the amount of funding necessary to accomplish this goal.

- For <u>food sustainability and food security</u> reasons, the Oahu facility should remain open to supply locally raised meat to people in Hawaii.
- Even if mainland meat shipments are currently available to the islands, this facility will be able to support local livestock farmers/ranchers, as they expand capacity.
- The Campbell facility is in close proximity to the market since most people live on Oahu.
- Most residents and island visitors are not vegetarians; they eat meat.
- Many in the community prefer fresh meat to that coming in from the mainland.
- Our understanding is that at the present time, the facility is used mainly for pork processing but that in the future it could also be used for beef processing.

RE: Comments in Opposition to SB249 SD1 HD1

On behalf of the World Society for the Protection of Animals (WSPA) and The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) and our more than 50,000 members and supporters in Hawaii, thank you for the opportunity to provide comments regarding SB249.

WSPA and The HSUS respectfully request your deferral of SB249 for the following reasons:

1. Past financial records indicate that the Hawaii Livestock Cooperative (HLC) slaughterhouse on Oahu is not an economically-viable facility The HLC slaughterhouse located at Campbell Industrial Park in Oahu has been in financial difficulty for the past several years.

The Farmers Livestock Cooperative and Palama Meat Company jointly approached the legislature in 1995 for a \$10 million loan (\$2 million of which was for constructing a slaughterhouse). The legislature approved this amount (see table below). In 2001, the Farmers Livestock Cooperative slaughterhouse in Ewa closed and the slaughterhouse moved to its current location in Campbell Industrial Park. The Farmers Livestock Cooperative became the HLC, and Palama Meat Company continued to be the guarantor for the \$10 million loan. Then, in 2003, Palama Meat Company filed for bankruptcy. It is unclear how much they still owed on that bond or who currently owns the slaughterhouse facilities. It is known, however, that the State of Hawaii owns the land on which the slaughterhouse stands.

The slaughterhouse has been bailed out multiple times using taxpayer money, as follows:

Despite all these bailouts, this facility is yet again approaching the Committee for financial support using taxpayer dollars. It is unrealistic to believe that this latest appropriation will ensure that the facility will become self-sustaining. Past financial records show that this is not an economically-viable facility and, therefore, this bailout will not be a responsible use of taxpayer money.

2. The slaughterhouse on Oahu will not help increase the viability of Hawaii's beef industry

SB249 claims that locally-raised cattle are being shipped to the mainland for finishing and slaughter and that an appropriation of \$1.6 million to purchase the HLC slaughterhouse will guarantee a local facility on Oahu for slaughtering these cattle.¹

However, in his testimony regarding SB249 on January 27, 2011², Mr. Alan Gottlieb, the Government Affairs Chair for the Hawaii Cattlemen's Council admitted: "... there are very limited cattle on Oahu for slaughter. Even if ALL of the Oahu cattle were kept in State, there would still be a fairly small amount of cattle for this facility." Mr. Leonard Oshiro, General Manager of the Hawaii Livestock Cooperative admitted in his testimony to this Committee that the slaughterhouse has "low slaughter numbers".³

In his testimony Mr. Gottlieb also observed that the practice of shipping calves to the mainland was not due to the lack of infrastructure (i.e. not due to the lack of finishing and slaughter facilities). He admits that even if the cattle currently being shipped to the mainland stayed in Hawaii, the County Cattlemen Associations have indicated they would prefer to have slaughter and processing facilities on the islands where these animals are being raised and would prefer to not ship their live cattle to Oahu for slaughter.⁴

3. The slaughterhouse on Oahu primarily slaughters imported pigs, which compromises animal welfare, decreases food safety and directly competes with local production

Publicly-available government records show that nearly 70% of the animals slaughtered at the Hawaii Livestock Cooperative facility are not locally-raised in Hawaii, but are transported live from mainland U.S. These animals travel for a week or longer, first by truck and then by ship, from as far away as lowa, South Dakota and Montana under extreme conditions that compromise their welfare and results in the death of many of these animals.

Studies have shown that long-distance transport could decrease immunity, increase vulnerability to disease and injury, which then facilitate the spread of disease and

infections and increases the suffering of the animals. Many foodborne illnesses such as *Salmonella* and Swine Flu have been linked to the long-distance transport of live farm animals.⁵

WSPA and The HSUS have conducted detailed studies on the potential impacts of long-distance transport of live animals on human health, the environment, consumers, local businesses and animal health, concluding that the USDA-regulated trade in fresh chilled and frozen meat is a safe alternative to transporting live animals that can satisfy the demand in Hawaii.

It is also our understanding that should this measure pass, Hawaii may be the *only* state in the nation that has a publicly-owned slaughterhouse. The slaughterhouse industry has typically been operated by private businesses, not funded by tax-payers or operated by the state, raising both ethical and fiscal concerns.

At a time when Hawaii is undergoing furloughs in order to conserve taxpayer money, the State's revenue from taxpayer money could be better spent in other sectors in order to keep essential industries functioning during these hard times.

In closing, we respectfully request that your Committee defer SB249.

Dear Legislators,

Aloha. My family and I are shocked to learn of Senate Bill 249 which would use taxpayer dollars for the State to purchase Hawaii Livestock Cooperative's slaughterhouse in Campbell Industrial Park. We do not want our hard-earned taxpayer dollars being used in this manner, and strongly oppose this bill for the reasons listed below. We humbly ask that you also oppose SB 249:

- We do not have the money; there are more important priorities: So many public services are being
 cut, schools are being closed, and workers are being furloughed, etc. due to State budget short-falls.
 The last place we should be spending taxpayer dollars is on an unnecessary slaughterhouse. There are
 much more "vital" needs towards which our taxpayer dollars should appropriately be used.
- 2. Taxpayer money should not be used to bail out failing businesses: Taxpayer dollars should never be used to buy, build, or operate a slaughterhouse, or any business for that matter. No other states own slaughterhouses—there are obvious reasons and logic in that. In addition, this slaughterhouse has been so unsuccessful that nobody in the private sector even wants to buy it. If the State operates this slaughterhouse through enactment of SB 249 it will likely be a severe ongoing drain on our State budget, something we just cannot afford.
- 3. It unnecessarily promotes bad health for the people of Hawaii: Hawaii is all about "food"—it is our multi-racial tradition and through which we express our aloha to our visitors and for each other. As a result, Hawaii has an overwhelming obesity problem, our children included. Many Hawaii healthcare organizations and individual professionals are working very hard (some for many years now) to try to eliminate that problem by educating our people on how to incorporate a more plant-based diet as part of a healthy aloha lifestyle. It therefore makes no sense (as well as being completely unnecessary) for the State to use taxpayer money to promote a meat-based diet, which has been linked to increased risk of heart disease, diabetes, obesity, cancer, and many other illnesses. - 4. Additionally, the meat industry is bad for the environment as it is an inefficient use of resources and is the most significant contributor to global warming. - 5. "The environmental impact of growing so much grain for animal feed is profound. Agriculture in the United States — much of which now serves the demand for meat — contributes to nearly three-quarters of all water-quality problems in the nation's rivers and streams, according to the Environmental Protection Agency.

Because the stomachs of cattle are meant to digest grass, not grain, cattle raised industrially thrive only in the sense that they gain weight quickly. This diet made it possible to remove cattle from their natural environment and encourage the efficiency of mass confinement and slaughter. But it causes enough health problems that administration of antibiotics is routine, so much so that it can result in antibiotic-resistant bacteria that threaten the usefulness of medicines that treat people.

Those grain-fed animals, in turn, are contributing to health problems among the world's wealthier citizens — heart disease, some types of cancer, diabetes. The argument that meat provides useful protein makes sense, if the quantities are small. But the "you gotta eat meat" claim collapses at American levels. Even if the amount of meat we eat weren't harmful, it's way more than enough."

If the argument of the environment, health, or animal welfare does not interest you, then as Cathy Goeggel points out the financial reasons this slaughterhouse should not be funded become paramount. We simply can't afford it. Funding this would be stealing from our kids educations, making our seniors suffer, ignoring the working class, and spiting the homeless.

State ownership of the Hawaii Livestock Cooperative's slaughterhouse is a risky and outlandish plan. As a teacher for the past 11 years I was very upset to hear about Senate Bill 249. We are currently having difficulty in this nation to find the funding to educate our children and the fact that State of Hawaii's legislature is even considering spending \$1.6 million on Hawaii Livestock Cooperative's slaughterhouse is an outrage. Following are the reasons why this bill **should not be passed**:

- 1. Is this slaughterhouse necessary? The question is why save this business and not others. How about putting the taxpayers money back into its future by investing not in a failed business, but by investing in its children to educate them properly.
- 2. As acknowledged by the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation and Russell Kokubun (Board of Agriculture), the Hawaii Livestock Cooperative has been failing for years and is currently in debt to the U.S. government for \$1.4 million dollars. - 1.We don't have the money. With so many public services being cut, such as schools being losed, workers being furloughed, etc. due to budget short-falls, the last place we should be spending taxpayer dollars is on an unnecessary slaughterhouse.

I thank the House Finance committee for hearing my testimony. I am Dr. William Harris and I spent 35 years in a local emergency clinic treating sick meat eaters. After retirement I collected 120 MB of peer reviewed scientific references linking animal food consumption to cardiovascular disease, obesity, types I and II diabetes, 6 types of cancer, renal disease, and a number of autoimmune diseases such as rheumatoid arthritis and lupus erythematosis.

At present there are no scientifically trained nutritionists recommending the consumption of more animal food and any such advertisements come from the meat and dairy lobbies, which are linked together like Siamese twins.

The USDA and the American Dietetic Association are both backing the 5-A-Day program advising five servings a day of pigmented fruits and vegetables. This is because the nutrients essential for humans are photosynthesized only by green plants and microorganisms. Eating animals may acquire those nutrients but only 2nd hand and with a generous portion of cholesterol, saturated fat, and autoimmunogenic protein, all having adverse health effects.

In addition, only plant foods contain the phytonutrients and antioxidants that suppress the diseases mentioned above. The USDA lists no animal foods at all in its Oxygen Radical Absorbance Capacity tables (ORAC).

Animal agriculture never holds its own on the free market for immutable principles of biochemistry, physics, and thermodynamics. The percent Protein:Calorie loss ratios: Eggs 78:82, Milk 75:85, Chicken 77:88, Pork 86:86, Beef 96:97 (which means that if you feed plant food to a steer it will waste 96% of the protein and 97% of the Calories that could have been processed into food for humans). Lamb comes in at 97:98 Ref: Scientific American Human Nutrition (monograph) ISBN 0-7167-0183-9 p 35.

This probably explains why the Hawaii legislature is bombarded on a yearly basis with pleas from the animal agriculturists in the most inflated language. For instance HB 2547 of 1997 stated that a new Ewa slaughterhouse was needed because " continuation of the livestock industry is critical to the State's economy." I checked the figures from DBEDT and the Hawaii Department of Agriculture and found that only .15 % of the 1996 Hawaii GSP was from animal agriculture sales and that in the years back to 1975 it had never even risen as high as .35%.

This year's SB249 wishes the taxpayers to shell out another \$1.6 million on a moribund slaughterhouse that started out in 1999 with a \$10 million Special Purpose Revenue Bond. It was built and subsequently mismanaged to the point of default and decrepitude.

For the health of Hawaii's citizens, I request that SB249 be defeated and that the Hawaii Livestock Cooperative be subjected to the same market forces that regulate the bountiful and healthy Hawaii plant foods that make it on their own on the free market. Thank you.

Aloha Chairman Oshiro and Members of the Committee,

Namaste. I have learned of your bill SB 249 to buy into a local slaughterhouse. Though I am not fully aware of the reasons behind it, I am assuming the proposed purchase is for business interests only. I am writing to hopefully give some insight into the spiritual repercussions of such an endeavor, as I'm sure you've already received lots of testimony regarding the hysical health repercussions of such a bill.

In various scriptures throughout the world, including the Holy Bible, God has ordained that the killing of animals, especially cows, is very displeasing to Him and therefore forbidden, and that He has already given us every type of food we need for our complete sustenance and survival.
