TO THE HONORABLE JOSH GREEN, M.D., CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Lee Ann Teshima, Executive Officer for the Board of Nursing ("Board") and I appreciate the opportunity to submit testimony on Senate Bill No. 38, Relating to Advanced Practice Registered Nurses. This bill proposes to allow an advanced practice registered nurse ("APRN") who meet the qualifications established by the Board to function as a primary care provider. The Board supports this bill as it would require hospitals licensed in this State to recognize the APRN as a primary care provider, and allow them to receive the same benefits as other primary care providers.

Re: SB 38 Relating to Advanced Practice Registered Nurses

Chair, Vice Chair, and committee members, thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony on SB 38 that would require hospitals to allow advanced practice registered nurses to practice within the full scope of the practice.

Kaiser Permanente Hawaii does not support it in this form, but offers an amendment.

Kaiser Permanente recognizes the high value of its advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs) within its integrated healthcare delivery system, and the exceptional care they provide to Kaiser's members. However, a distinguishing factor under Kaiser's delivery system is that Kaiser's APRN's scope of practice is defined within their scope of employment.

Kaiser sometimes hires APRNs to work in positions that do not, by design, utilize their full scope but fill existing needs. The APRN who accepts such a position does so with the knowledge of the requirements and limitations outlined in their job description. We suggest the following amendment to address these circumstances:

On page 1, line 11, add to the last sentence the phrase "unless limited by the terms of their employment."

Therefore, § 323 shall now read:

§ 3 2 3 - Practice by advanced practice registered nurses.

Each hospital in the State licensed under section 321-14.5 shall allow an advanced practice registered nurse recognized as such under section 457-8.5 or a qualified advanced practice registered nurse granted prescriptive authority under section 457-8.6 to practice within the full
