1 Department's Position: The Department of Health supports this bill.

2 Fiscal Implications: Maintain solid waste program funding

- 3 Purpose and Justification: The purpose of this bill is to clarify that the solid waste management
- 4 surcharge shall also apply to waste-to-energy facilities and facilities that prepare waste for final
- 5 disposition outside the state of Hawaii.
- The department supports the changes proposed by this bill because they will help us address the
- 7 changing waste management field. The solid waste management surcharge is the main funding source
- 8 for the department's solid waste regulatory program. The current surcharge is 35 cents per ton and is
- 9 applied to landfills and incinerators, including H-Power.
- The department is aware of waste-to-energy facilities that are proposing the use of new
- technologies that the current solid waste management surcharge would not apply to. The past year has
- also seen attempts to ship waste out of the state for disposal. Solid waste program funding is already
- below sustainable levels. Allowing the changes proposed in this bill would help the solid waste
- 14 program to maintain current funding levels.
