I am Roger Reeves, Centerplate's Director of Operations for the Hawai'i Region, testifying in support of S.B. 741. The bill would authorize county liquor commissions to require training and certification for liquor servers and sellers.

For 19 years, Centerplate has been the concessionaire for the Waikiki Shell and Neal S. Blaisdell Center, and for the past 10 years, we have been the concessionaire for the Aloha Stadium. Centerplate supports S.B. 741 because requiring liquor servers and sellers to be certified helps ensure that employees understand liquor laws and act responsibly. It should be noted that in some states (e.g., Texas, Florida), businesses are entitled to "Safe Harbor" protection from fines and penalties related to liquor server and seller employees' actions if those servers and sellers are trained and certified by liquor commission-approved certification programs.
