I am Kenneth G. Silva, Chair of the State Fire Council (SFC) and Fire Chief of the Honolulu Fire Department (HFD). The SFC and the HFD support S.B. 782, S.D. 2, which prohibits any person from possessing, constructing, setting off, igniting, discharging, or otherwise causing to explode any homemade explosive device.

The bill seeks to establish a violation of this prohibition as a Class C felony. These devices are a potential danger to life and property, and the discharging creates a loud disturbance to the surrounding community. We believe the proposed penalty will be a deterrent to individuals who may consider constructing or setting off these devices.

The SFC and the HFD also offer the following comments:

- 1. We support the statewide ban of consumer fireworks, except for special events and professional public fireworks displays.
- We believe each county should continue to determine potential fireworks hazards and benefits to their community and impose stricter fireworks laws than the state based on each county's needs and resources.
- We support measures that make for easier arrest and prosecution of illegal purchase, possession, setting off, igniting, or discharging of fireworks and increase penalties and consequences for convictions of fireworks violations.

S.B. No. 782 SD2: RELATING TO DANGEROUS WEAPONS

Chair Keith-Agaran and Members of the Committee:

We have concerns about S.B. No. 782 SD2 which seeks to establish a Class C felony offense for constructing or setting off a homemade explosive device. Our concern is regarding the definition of "homemade explosive device." The lines 16 and 17 on page 1 of the definition is very vague. It is unclear when a device would be "capable of instantaneously releasing a sufficient amount of energy to inflict substantial damage to persons or property." The term "substantial damage" is not accompanied by any standards as are the criminal property damage laws which specify dollar amounts of damage. One could argue that a small homemade firecracker which would leave a chip or burn mark on a building would fall under this measure. Would it be the intent of the legislature to punish homemade firecrackers as a Class C felony?

Also, it would seem that H.R.S. § 134-8(a) already covers the conduct addressed in this bill. That section prohibits the manufacture or possession of any explosive and punishes the illegal possession as a Class C felony.
