
Chair Takumi, Vice Chair Belatti and members of the Committee:

RE: SB 8, SD 1 - RELATING TO EDUCATION

Dear Chair Takumi and Members of the Committee,

The Special Education Advisory Council (SEAC), Hawaii's State Advisory Panel under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), supports SB 8, SD1 which proposes implementing legislation for the appointment of Board of Education members by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate.

SEAC appreciates that this bill requires the Senate to consider "a broad representation of education-related stakeholders" that reflects the diversity of the students who are served in public schools. We strongly hold that individuals with expertise regarding special education policy and programming are crucial members of the Board given the unique and often complex needs of students with disabilities.

SEAC is in favor of amending the bill to include the Board of Education Selection Advisory Council that is delineated in HB 338. The added educational expertise of this proposed Selection Advisory Council will help to ensure well qualified nominees for appointment. The Council also provides a check and balance to minimize the potential for politicization of the nomination process. Once the Governor has made his choice of appointees from the nominees offered by the Council, the public will have an opportunity to provide testimony during the Senate confirmation process.
