Since 2002 we have restructured the marketing of our cattle at Kaupo Ranch along with other Maui Cattle Company's partnering ranching operations to transition from shipping live calves to the mainland to providing beef for our local market. We are starting to see more and more Hawaii ranchers move toward keeping their cattle at home for local consumption.

In order to support this movement both farmers and ranchers needs to be able to sell their products to markets that at one time purchased the majority of their products from distributors brining in product from out of state. In order to create a growing local market which will support small business, we need to open up as many potential markets as possible and allow local agriculture production the time needed to gear up to this expanding market.

It would be of great benefit to Hawaii's farmers and ranchers that the chief procurement officers in the state become one of these markets by purchasing more locally grown products within the State system.
