Senator Baker rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Last night sometime after 8:00 p.m. Hawai'i time, Japan experienced a devastating 8.9 magnitude earthquake. It wreaked havoc on land, causing widespread property damage, disrupting commerce, and taking lives. It also generated a potential devastating tsunami for Hawai'i and the Pacific basin including the west coast of the mainland U.S. Hawai'i prepared for the coming tsunami, evacuated to higher ground or higher floors, and waited. It was a restless night for so many.

"I wanted to take a moment to thank all our state and county emergency personnel; our visitor industry leaders and staff who helped comfort and take care of our many visitors, including those from Japan who were understandably worried about their homeland; and all our citizens who followed the directions from police and civil defense and sought shelter and higher ground. I stay in a hotel in Waikīkī during session, and I have to say I was impressed with how that facility and others were prepared for

and executed disaster plans in the face of the impending tsunami. I want to express thanks to Ke Akua that although Hawai'i's normal routines were disrupted and there was some flooding and property damage, there was no loss of life. Our warning and emergency management systems from state and county civil defense to DOT highways, airports and harbors, health, and other state personnel to county first-responders, private business leaders who are part of the local emergency operations centers—all entities charged with keeping us safe—worked very well and collaboratively together. And finally mahalo to our local media who stayed on the air all night long to keep all of us informed.

"Hawai'i and the U.S. mainland dodged the devastating effects of the tsunami. Our brothers and sisters in Japan were not so fortunate. So, Mr. President, I ask that the Senate adjourn on a rising vote in sympathy with the Japanese people as they rebuild and recover and in memory of those who lost their lives. Mahalo."

## ADJOURNMENT

At 11:42 a.m., on motion by Senator Espero, seconded by Senator Slom and carried, the Senate adjourned until 11:30 a.m., Monday, March 14, 2011, on a rising vote, observing a moment of silence in sympathy for the people of Japan who suffered through the earthquake and tsunami and in honor and memory of those whose lives were lost.
