## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
- 2 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 3 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.
- 4 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that organ
- 5 transplantation is a life-saving therapy for many critically ill
- 6 patients with end-stage diseases. More than one hundred ten
- 7 thousand patients are on the national organ transplant waiting
- 8 list; four hundred seven of those patients are Hawaii residents.
- 9 Funding is critical to maintain a federally-recognized
- 10 stage 3 chronic kidney disease program that focuses on
- 11 prevention for disparate populations in Hawaii. Without
- 12 operational organ transplant services in the State, patients
- 13 with end-stage diseases must register on transplant waiting
- 14 lists for mainland transplant centers and many of these patients
- 15 will face a longer waiting time to receive a donor organ at a
- 16 transplant center on the mainland than at a transplant center in
- 17 Hawaii. The increased waiting time for an organ may mean that

- 1 the sickest of those patients may not survive long enough for a
- 2 donor organ to become available. In addition to the increased
- 3 waiting time, many waitlisted patients in the State will have
- 4 the additional burden of relocating to other areas of the
- 5 country, away from friends and family, while awaiting a donor
- 6 organ and during their recovery.
- 7 An emergency appropriation is necessary to preserve and
- 8 save the lives of individuals combating organ failure by
- 9 providing them with access to organ transplantation in the State
- 10 and giving them quality care and treatment throughout their
- 11 operation and recovery.
- 12 National Kidney Foundation of Hawaii provides a federally-
- 13 recognized chronic kidney disease management program in Hawaii.
- 14 It meets the eligibility requirements of section 42F-103, Hawaii
- 15 Revised Statutes, for recipients of grants and subsidies. The
- 16 Queen's Medical Center is establishing a kidney and liver
- 17 transplant program in Hawaii. It also meets the eligibility
- 18 requirements of section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for
- 19 recipients of grants and subsidies, with the exception of
- 20 approval as a member of the Organ Procurement and
- 21 Transplantation Network/United Network for Organ Sharing with
- 22 designations as a liver transplant program and a kidney and

- 1 living donor kidney transplant program, for which it has applied
- 2 and which it expects to receive approval on or before February
- 3 15, 2012.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate emergency funds,
- 5 subject to dollar-for-dollar private matching funds, to support
- 6 services by The Queen's Medical Center to perform kidney and
- 7 liver transplants in Hawaii, and by the National Kidney
- 8 Foundation of Hawaii to maintain its chronic kidney disease
- 9 management program.
- 10 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000 or so much
- 12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 as a grant
- 13 pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for The
- 14 Queen's Medical Center to support services to perform kidney and
- 15 liver transplants in Hawaii; provided that:
- 16 (1) No funds appropriated under this Act shall be expended
- unless matched dollar-for-dollar with private funds;

- 19 (2) Any private matching funds obtained for the purposes
- of this Act shall have priority in being encumbered
- over public funds.

- 3 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general

- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 as a grant

- 7 Kidney Foundation of Hawaii to maintain its chronic kidney
- 8 disease management program; provided that:
- 9 (1) No funds appropriated under this Act shall be expended
- unless matched dollar-for-dollar with private funds;

- 12 (2) Any private matching funds obtained for the purposes
- of this Act shall have priority in being encumbered
- 14 over public funds.
- 15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 16 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 18 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 19 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 20 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 21 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 22 of this Act are severable.

- 1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 2 provided that section 3 of this Act shall take effect on the
- 3 date on which The Queen's Medical Center obtains approval as a
- 4 member of the Organ Procurement and Transplantation
- 5 Network/United Network for Organ Sharing with designations as a
- 6 liver transplant program and a kidney and living donor kidney
- 7 transplant program, and provided that a copy of the document
- 8 evidencing the approval is delivered to the department of

9 health.
