## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 304A-802, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 2 3 There is established at the university and the 4 community colleges a college-credit equivalency program. 5 purpose of this program is to award college credits to students 6 who are enrolled in a degree or certificate program at the 7 university or at a community college and who have successfully 8 completed, at a high school, business school, trade school, 9 adult education school, or military training program, courses 10 that are equivalent to courses offered for credit in the 11 University of Hawaii system. The program shall also award credits for professional experience gained through service in 12 the United States armed forces. Credits may also be awarded for 13 14 work or other experiences at the discretion of the university. The university shall be responsible for the 15 (b) establishment of policies and procedures to administer the 16 program. In this regard, the university, among other things, 17 shall prepare and make public the following: 18
