A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 431:10A-126, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 2 is amended to read as follows:

- 4 treatment. (a) Notwithstanding section 23-51, all individual
- 5 and group accident and health or sickness insurance policies
- 6 that include coverage or benefits for the treatment of cancer
- 7 shall provide payment or reimbursement for all types of
- 8 chemotherapy that [is] are considered medically necessary as
- 9 defined in section 432E-1.4[, including].
- 10 (b) The cost-sharing for generic and non-generic [orally
- 11 administered] oral chemotherapy[7] shall be provided at the same
- 12 or lower [copayment percentage or relative coinsurance] amount
- 13 or percentage as is applied to generic and non-generic
- 14 intravenously administered chemotherapy; provided that [this
- 15 section-shall not apply to an accident only, specified disease,
- 16 hospital indemnity, long term care, or other limited benefit
- 17 health insurance policy.] an insurer shall not increase the
