A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR COMMUNITY SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 371K-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$371K-3 General functions, duties, and powers of the 4 **executive director.** The executive director shall: 5 (1) Serve as the principal official in state government 6 responsible for the coordination of programs for the 7 needy, poor, and disadvantaged persons, refugees, and 8 immigrants; 9 (2) Oversee, supervise, and direct the performance by 10 subordinates of activities in such areas as planning, 11 evaluation, and coordination of programs for 12 disadvantaged persons, refugees, and immigrants and 13 development of a statewide service delivery network: 14 (3) Assess the policies and practices of public and 15 private agencies impacting on the disadvantaged and 16 conduct advocacy efforts on behalf of the

3	SECTION 2. Section 371K-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	repealed.
5	["[\$371K-5] Advisory council for community services;
6	composition and compensation. (a) There is established within
7	the office of community services, the advisory council for
8	community services, herein referred to as council, except as
9	otherwise indicated. The council shall be composed of twelve
10	members appointed by the governor subject to section 26-34,
11	except as provided in this section. Members shall have had
12	training, experience, or special knowledge concerning human
13	services programs. Of the twelve members:
14	(1) Four members shall be representatives of elient groups
15	served by the office of community services which shall
16	include: one member from the client group previously
17	served by the progressive neighborhood program; one
18	member from the client group previously served by the
19	Hawaii office of economic opportunity; one member from
20	the client group previously served by the refugee
21	resettlement program; and one member from the client

1		group previously served by the state immigrant
2		services center;

12	SECT	ION 3. Section 371K-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	repealed.	
14	[" [S	371K-6] Council, duties. The council shall:
15	(1)	Advise the executive director, the governor, and the
16		legislature on matters relating to programs and
17		services for the disadvantaged, refugees, and
18		immigrants;
19	(2)	Assist the executive director in determining program
20		and policy needs and priorities for the State in
21		establishing and implementing a comprehensive program
22		for the disadvantaged, refugees, and immigrants in

1		accordance with the goals and objectives expressed in
2		this chapter;
3	(3)	Assist the executive director in formulating short-
4		term and long-range goals-for-programs and services
5		for the disadvantaged, refugees, and immigrants;
6	-(4)	Assist the executive director in consulting with and
7		seeking the opinion of the general public in relation
8		to a comprehensive system of programs and services for
9		the disadvantaged, refugees, and immigrants;
10	(5)	Assist the executive director in the evaluation of
11		general and specific policies relating to the needs of
12		the disadvantaged, refugees, and immigrants; and
13	(6) -	Assist the executive director in encouraging both
14		public and private agencies and programs to work
15		toward the development and maintenance of a
16		comprehensive and coordinated system for human
17		services."]

20	SECT:	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
