ACT 041 H.B. NO. 2539 H.D. 1

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADULT ABUSE PERPETRATOR CHECKS FOR CHILD CARE PROVIDERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 346-152.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+]\$346-152.5[+] Criminal history [and] record checks,
- 4 child abuse record checks, and adult abuse perpetrator checks
- 5 for persons exempt pursuant to section 346-152. To be eligible
- 6 to provide child care and to receive a child care subsidy from
- 7 the department, persons exempt pursuant to section 346-152 shall
- 8 be required to agree to a criminal history record check [and], a
- 9 child abuse record check, and an adult abuse perpetrator check
- 10 in the same manner as a prospective applicant or licensed
- 11 provider in accordance with section 346-154; provided that the
- 12 following relatives of the child who requires care:
- 13 grandparents, great-grandparents, aunts, uncles, and siblings
- 14 aged eighteen or older living in a separate residence shall be
- 15 required to agree to a criminal history record check conducted
- 16 through files maintained by the Hawaii criminal justice data

- center [and], a child abuse record check[-], and an adult abuse
 perpetrator check.

 for the purposes of this section, "adult abuse perpetrator
- 4 check" means a search to determine whether an individual is
- 5 known to the department as a perpetrator of abuse as defined in
- 6 section 346-222, by means of a search of the individual's name
- 7 and birth date in the department's adult protective services
- 8 file."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 346-154, Hawaii Revised Statutes is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 "§346-154 Criminal history [and] checks, child abuse
- 12 record checks[-], and adult abuse perpetrator checks. (a) The
- 13 department shall develop standards to ensure the reputable and
- 14 responsible character of an applicant to operate a child care
- 15 facility, prospective employees of the applicant, and new
- 16 employees of the provider after registration or licensure, which
- 17 shall include criminal history record checks in accordance with
- 18 section 846-2.7 [and], child abuse record checks[+], and adult
- 19 abuse perpetrator checks.
- For the purposes of this section, "adult abuse perpetrator
- 21 check" means a search to determine whether an individual is
- 22 known to the department as a perpetrator of abuse as defined in

2	and birth	date in the department's adult protective services
3	file.	
4	(b)	An applicant to operate a child care facility shall:
5	(1)	Be subject to criminal history record checks in
6		accordance with section 846-2.7;
7	(2)	Submit to the department under penalty of law,
8		statements signed by the applicant and prospective
9		employees of the applicant indicating whether the
10		applicant or any of the prospective employees has ever
11		been confirmed to have abused or neglected a child[$ au$]
12		or vulnerable adult, including threatened harm; and
13	(3)	Provide consent to the department to conduct a
14		criminal history record check in accordance with
15		section 846-2.7 [and], a child abuse record check, and
16		an adult abuse perpetrator check, and to obtain
17		criminal history [and] information, child abuse record
18		information, and adult abuse perpetrator information
19		for verification.
20	(c)	A provider shall:
21	(1)	Be subject to criminal history record checks in
22		accordance with section 846-2.7;

1	(2)	Submit to the department a statement signed by any
2		employee hired after the initial licensure or
3		registration that requires the employee to indicate
4		under penalty of law, whether the employee has ever
5		been confirmed to have abused or neglected a child[7]
6		or vulnerable adult, including threatened harm; and
7	(3)	Provide consent to the department or its designee to
8		conduct a criminal history record check in accordance
9		with section 846-2.7 [and], a child abuse record
10		check, and an adult abuse perpetrator check, and to
11		obtain criminal history [and] information, child abuse
12		record information and adult abuse perpetrator check
13		information for verification.
14	(d)	The department or its designee shall obtain criminal
15	history re	ecord information through the Hawaii criminal justice
16	data cent	er in accordance with section 846-2.7, and child abuse
17	record in	formation and adult abuse perpetrator check information
18	from the	department in accordance with departmental procedures
19	on the app	plicant and any prospective employee of the applicant,
20	including	any new employee retained after the applicant is

issued a registration or license under this part, which shall

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1	include	an	annual	name	inquiry	into	the	state	criminal	history

- (e) The department may deny an application for a licenseor registration to operate a child care facility if:
- 5 (1) The applicant or any prospective employee has been convicted of a crime other than a minor traffic violation involving a fine of \$50 or less, or ever been confirmed to have abused or neglected a child[7] or vulnerable adult, including threatened harm; and
- 10 (2) The department finds that the criminal history or

 11 child abuse record or adult abuse perpetrator check

 14 may pose a risk to the health, safety, or well-being

 15 of children.
- (f) The department may request the provider to terminate
 the employment of a new employee or may suspend or revoke the
 license or registration of the provider who employs a new
 employee if:
- 20 (1) The employee has been convicted of a crime other than
 21 a minor traffic violation involving a fine of \$50 or
 22 less, or ever been confirmed to have abused or

1		neglected a child or vulnerable adult, including
2		threatened harm; and
3	(2)	The department finds that the criminal history or
4		child abuse record or adult abuse perpetrator check
5		record of the new employee indicates that the new
6		employee may pose a risk to the health, safety, or
7		well-being of children."

10	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
