A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the American
- 2 Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, formerly known as
- 3 the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists,
- 4 recommends that pelvic examinations undertaken for teaching
- 5 purposes should be performed with the specific informed consent
- 6 of the patient. Informed consent ensures the patient
- 7 understands the procedure and its attendant risks and benefits
- 8 and agrees to the procedure being performed. The legislature
- 9 also finds that the American Medical Association recommends
- 10 discussing medical student involvement with patient procedures
- 11 whenever possible.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to require informed consent in
- 13 certain circumstances before performing pelvic examinations for
- 14 medical and training purposes on anesthetized or unconscious
- 15 female patients.
- 16 SECTION 2. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 18 and to read as follows:
