A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide essential
- 2 home- and community-based services for Hawaii's elderly
- 3 population by codifying the authorization for the establishment
- 4 of the kupuna care program and appropriating funds to support
- 5 the needs of Hawaii's older adults and elderly individuals.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 349, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 8 and to read as follows:
- 9 "§349- Kupuna care program. (a) The executive office
- 10 on aging may establish the kupuna care program. The program
- 11 shall provide affordable and quality home- and community-based
- 12 services.
- (b) The program may be provided in every county as a
- 14 <u>function of the aging and disability resource centers.</u>
- 15 (c) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise
- 16 requires:

1	"Aging and disability resource centers" means an entity		
2	established by the State as part of the state system of long-		
3	term care, serving as a highly visible and trusted source where		
4	people of all incomes and ages can get information on the full		
5	range of long-term support options, and a single point of entry		
6	for access to public long-term support programs and benefits.		
7	"Family caregivers" means a spouse, adult child, other		
8	relative, partner, or friend who has a personal relationship		
9	with, and provides a broad range of unpaid assistance for an		
10	older adult with a chronic or disabling condition.		
11	(d) The director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91		
12	necessary for the purposes of this section."		
13	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
14	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$4,200,000 or so much		
15	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the		
16	kupuna care program; provided that the sum appropriated shall be		
17	in addition to the base budget of the executive office on aging.		
18	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of		
19	health for the purposes of this Act.		
20	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general		
21	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$426,772 or so much

- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the
- 2 healthy aging partnership program of the department of health's
- 3 executive office on aging.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$285,000 or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 to provide
- 9 funding for grants, pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised
- 10 Statutes, for senior centers and to be distributed as follows:
- 11 (1) Catholic Charities Hawaii for the
- 12 Lanakila multi-purpose senior center \$175,000;
- 13 (2) Moiliili Community Center for the
- Moiliili senior center \$50,000; and
- 15 (3) Waikiki Community Center \$60,000;
- 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 17 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 as a

2	Alzheimer	's Association, Aloha Chapter, to:
3	(1)	Establish a wanderer's registration service to protect
4		individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related
5		dementia;
6	(2)	Conduct targeted outreach throughout the State to
7		increase enrollment in the national wanderer's
8		registry and offer scholarships and subsidies to low-
9		income families, as defined by the United States
10		Department of Health and Human Services' 2011 poverty
11		guidelines for Hawaii, who want to enroll in the
12		registry; and
13	(3)	Conduct annual training for first responders and other
14		community members to increase awareness and provide
15		ongoing education on best practices for search and
16		rescue efforts for people with dementia.
17	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
18	health fo	r the purposes of this Act.
19	SECT	ION 7. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
