### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES ON OCEAN WATERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to authorize the
2	department of land and natural resources to regulate commercial
3	enterprises that operate out of private marinas and use state
4	waters or marine resources. It is not the intent of this Act to
5	provide for additional regulation of existing regulated commercial
6	enterprises, but to address currently unregulated activities only.
7	SECTION 2. Section 200-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	"[+]§200-3[+] Ocean recreation and coastal areas programs.
10	The board shall assume the following functions of the department
11	of transportation:
12	(1) Managing and administering the ocean-based recreation
13	and coastal areas programs of the State;
14	(2) Planning, developing, operating, administering, and
15	maintaining small boat harbors, launching ramps, and
16	other boating facilities and associated aids to
17	navigation throughout the State;

1	(3)	Developing and administering an ocean recreation
2		management plan;
3	(4)	Administering and operating a vessel registration
4		system for the State;
5	(5)	Regulating the commercial use of [boating facilities;
6		state waters and marine resources, including
7		operations originating from private marinas;
8	(6)	Regulating boat regattas and other ocean water events
9	(7)	Administering a marine casualty and investigation
10		program;
11	(8)	Assisting in abating air, water, and noise pollution;
12	(9)	Conducting public education in boating safety;
13	(10)	Administering the boating special fund;
14	(11)	Assisting in controlling shoreline erosion;
15	(12)	Repairing seawalls and other existing coastal
16		protective structures under the jurisdiction of the
17		State; and
18	(13)	Removing nonnatural obstructions and public safety
19		hazards from the shoreline, navigable streams,
20		harbors, channels, and coastal areas of the State."
21	SECT	ION 3. Section 200-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
22	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

4		and moor, anchor, or dock at small boat harbors,

8		passengers at small boat harbors, launching ramps,
9		other boating facilities, and public beaches;
10	(3)	For the safety of small boat harbors, launching ramps,
11		and other boating facilities, and the vessels anchored
12		or moored therein;
13	(4)	For the conduct of the public using small boat
14		harbors, launching ramps, and other boating facilities
15	•	owned or controlled by the State;
16	(5)	To regulate and control recreational and commercial
17		use of small boat harbors, launching ramps, and other
18		boating facilities owned or controlled by the State
19		and the ocean waters and navigable streams of the

21	(6)	To prevent the discharge or throwing into small boat

harbors, launching ramps, other boating facilities,

2	refuse, garbage, or other substances likely to affect
3	the quality of the water or that contribute to making

5	facilities, ocean waters, and streams unsightly,

7	up, shoal, or shallow the waters in, near, or
8	affecting small boat harbors, launching ramps, and
9	other boating facilities and the ocean waters and
10	navigable streams of the State, and likewise to
11	prevent the escape of fuel or other oils or substances
12	into the waters in, near, or affecting small boat
13	harbors, launching ramps, or other boating facilities
14	and the ocean waters and navigable streams of the
15	State from any source point, including[7] but not
16	limited to[7] any vessel or from pipes or storage
17	tanks upon land[. The rules may include:], including:
18	(A) Requirements for permits and fees for:
19	(i) The mooring, docking, or anchoring of
20	recreational and commercial vessels or the
21	launching of recreational or commercial

6	(D) Any other rule necessary to implement this
7	chapter pertaining to small boat harbors,
8	launching ramps, and other boating facilities
9	belonging to or controlled by the State;
10 (7)	To continue the ocean recreational and coastal areas
11	programs and govern the ocean waters and navigable
12	streams of the State, and beaches encumbered with
13	easements in favor of the public to protect and foster
14	public peace and tranquility and to promote public
15	safety, health, and welfare in or on the ocean waters
16	and navigable streams of the State, and on beaches
17	encumbered with easements in favor of the public[-
18	The rules may include: ], including:
19	(A) Regulating the anchoring and mooring of vessels,
20	houseboats, and other contrivances outside of any
21	harbor or boating facility, including:
22	(i) The designation of offshore mooring areas;

4	"Commercial activity" means to engage in any
5	action or attempt to engage in any action for
6	compensation in any form. The action or actions may
7	include providing or attempting to provide guide
8	services, charters, tours, and transportation to and
9	from the location or locations for which such services
10	are provided.
11	"Compensation" means money, barter, trade,
12	credit, and other instruments of value, goods, and
13	other forms of payment."
14	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
