A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMPUTER CRIME.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part IX to be appropriately 2 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 Computer fraud in the third degree. (1) A 5 person commits the offense of computer fraud in the third degree 6 if the person knowingly accesses a computer, computer system, or 7 computer network with the intent to commit the offense of theft 8 in the third or fourth degree. 9 (2) Computer fraud in the third degree is a class C 10 felony." 11 SECTION 2. Section 708-891, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "[f]§708-891[f] Computer fraud in the first degree. 14 A person commits the offense of computer fraud in the first 15 degree if the person knowingly[- and with intent to defraud, 16 accesses a computer without authorization and, by means of such **17** conduct, obtains or exerts control over the property of another.

- 1 (2) In a prosecution for computer fraud in the first
- 2 degree, it is a defense that the object of the fraud and the
- 3 property obtained consists only of the use of the computer and
- 4 the value of such use is not more than \$300 in any one-year
- 5 period.] accesses a computer, computer system, or computer
- 6 network with the intent to commit the offense of theft in the
- 7 first degree.
- 8 $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$ (2) Computer fraud in the first degree is a class $\left[\frac{1}{2}\right]$

- 10 SECTION 3. Section 708-891.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 "[+]\$708-891.5[+] Computer fraud in the second degree.
- 13 (1) A person commits the offense of computer fraud in the
- 14 second degree if the person knowingly[and with the intent to
- 15 defraud, transfers, or otherwise disposes of, to another, or
- 16 obtains control of, with the intent to transfer or dispose of,
- 17 any password or similar information through which a computer,
- 18 computer system, or computer network may accessed. accesses a
- 19 computer, computer system, or computer network with the intent
- 20 to commit the offense of theft in the second degree.
- 21 (2) Computer fraud in the second degree is a class [@] B
- 22 felony."

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 708-895.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+]\$708-895.5[+] Unauthorized computer access in the 4 first degree. (1) A person commits the offense of unauthorized 5 computer access in the first degree if the person knowingly 6 accesses a computer, computer system, or computer network 7 without authorization and thereby obtains information, and: 8 (a) The offense was committed for the purpose of 9 commercial or private financial gain; The offense was committed in furtherance of any other 10 (b) 11 crime; The value of the information obtained exceeds 12 (c) [\$5,000;] \$20,000; or 13 14 (d) The information has been determined by statute or rule of court to require protection against unauthorized 15 16 disclosure. 17 (2) Unauthorized computer access in the first degree is a 18 class [B] A felony." 19 SECTION 5. Section 708-895.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 20 "[f]\$708-895.6[f] Unauthorized computer access in the 21 (1) A person commits the offense of 22 second degree.

- 9 third degree. (1) A person commits the offense of unauthorized
- 10 computer access in the third degree if the person knowingly
- 11 accesses a computer, computer system, or computer network
- 12 without authorization.
- (2) Unauthorized computer access in the third degree is a
- 14 [misdemeanor.] class C felony."
- 15 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 16 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 17 begun before its effective date.
- 18 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
