A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECKS FOR COUNTY EMPLOYEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Section 378-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows: 3 "(d) Notwithstanding subsections (b) and (c), the 4 requirement that inquiry into and consideration of a prospective 5 employee's conviction record may take place only after the individual has received a conditional job offer, and the 6 7 limitation to the most recent ten-year period, excluding the 8 period of incarceration, shall not apply to employers who are expressly permitted to inquire into an individual's criminal 9 10 history for employment purposes pursuant to any federal or state law other than subsection (a), including: 11 12 (1) The State or any of its branches, political 13 subdivisions, or agencies pursuant to sections 78-2.7 14 and 831-3.1; 15 (2) The department of education pursuant to section 302A-16 601.5; 17 (3) The department of health with respect to employees,
