Dear President Tsutsui, Speaker Say, and Members of the Legislature:

Re: House Bill No. 280, H.D. 1, S.D. 2, C.D. 1

On July 10, 2012, House Bill No. 280, H.D. 1, S.D. 2, C.D. 1, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to Agriculture" became law as Act 328 without my signature, pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

The purpose of this bill is to establish as a class C felony the offense of false labeling of the geographic origin of Hawaii-grown coffee, mandate that Hawaii-grown coffee bean packages be marked with or contain documentation of the coffee's geographic origin, and repeal the requirement that Hawaii-grown green coffee beans be inspected and certified by the Hawaii Department of Agriculture for grade and origin.

The state has to protect the reputation of Hawaii-grown agricultural products, particularly products that are an iconic symbol of the islands. The process and resources that are currently in place need to be strengthened and made more comprehensive. This bill is a first step for the state Department of Agriculture to look at what is necessary to protect our state products. I will be asking the state Department of Agriculture to work with stakeholders to develop additional steps to accomplish this end.

Therefore, notwithstanding my concerns, I have allowed House Bill No. 280, H.D. 1, S.D. 2, C.D. 1, to become law as Act 328, on July 10, 2012, without my signature.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 7 SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 8 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 9 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 10 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 11 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 12 of this Act are severable.
- 13 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
