A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 286-137, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"§286-137 District courts to keep records[-]; disclosure.		
4	(a) The district court of each circuit shall keep, maintain,		
5	and control or shall otherwise provide for the keeping,		
6	maintaining, and controlling of proper and accurate records of		
7	each conviction or bail forfeiture or any other disposition of		
8	each violation $[ef]$ by a licensee coming within this part. The		
9	district court shall delete from the licensee's record any		
10	reference to a violation that the licensee has been found by the		
11	court not to have committed.		
12	(b) The district court shall not disclose, other than to a		
13	law enforcement agency or the licensee, a disposition in which		
14	the licensee was found to have committed a traffic infraction if		
15	that disposition precedes the request for disclosure by more		
16	than years; provided that:		
17	(1) If at the time of the request for disclosure, there is		

present in the licensee's record an outstanding

1		traffic infraction, the disclosure shall not exceed
2		the three years preceding the date of the oldest
3		outstanding infraction; and
4	(2)	The limitation on disclosure shall not apply to the
5		record of any:
6		(A) Criminal conviction;
7		(B) Holder of a commercial driver's license; or
8		(C) Conviction of a driver who was operating a
9		commercial motor vehicle without a commercial
10		driver's license when such a license was
11		required.
12	<u>(c)</u>	The district court of each circuit shall [also]

20	SECT	ION 2. Section 287-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

- 1 "(a) The traffic violations bureaus of the district
- 2 courts, upon request, shall furnish any person a certified
- 3 abstract of the bureaus' record, if any, of any person relating
- 4 to [all alleged] convictions or civil judgments for moving
- 5 violations [and any convictions resulting therefrom], arising
- 6 from the operation of a motor vehicle and any administrative
- 7 license revocation pursuant to chapter 291E, part III and
- 8 chapter 286, part XIV, as it was in effect on or before December
- 9 31, 2001. The traffic violations bureaus may collect a fee, not
- 10 to exceed \$20, of which \$18 shall be deposited into the general
- 11 fund and \$2 shall be deposited into the judiciary computer
- 12 system special fund."
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 14 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 15 begun before its effective date.
- 16 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on October 1, 2012.

Report Title:

Traffic Abstract; Expungement; Limitation on Disclosure

Description:

Requires district court to delete from a driver's traffic abstract any violation that the driver is found not to have committed. Prohibits disclosure of dispositions of infractions that precede the date of request by more than years. Specifies that only convictions or civil judgments for moving violations and administrative driver's license revocations be released on a certified traffic abstract. Effective October 1, 2012. (HB14 HD1)
