A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RESIDENCY OF APPOINTIVE OFFICERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 78-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 All appointive officers in the service of the 4 government of the State or any county who are employed as 5 department heads and deputies or assistants to a department head 6 shall be citizens of the United States and residents of the 7 State for at least one year immediately preceding their 8 appointment[-]; provided that the foregoing one year residency 9 requirement may be waived by the appointing authority when the 10 appointive officer is required to have highly specialized or 11 scientific knowledge and training and a qualified applicant who is a resident for at least one year is not available to fill the 12 13 position. All others appointed in the service of the government 14 of the State or in the service of any county or municipal 15 subdivision of the State shall be citizens, nationals, or 16 permanent resident aliens of the United States and residents of 17 the State at the time of their appointment. - 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.
