RELATING TO COMPUTER CRIME.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

4	"§708- Computer fraud in the third degree. (1) A
5	person commits the offense of computer fraud in the third degree

8	in the third or fourth degree.
9	(2) Computer fraud in the third degree is a class C
10	felony."
