A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMPUTER CRIME.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

4	"S708- Computer fraud in the third degree. (1) A
5	person commits the offense of computer fraud in the third degree

8	obtain identifying information, with the intent to commit the
9	offense of theft in the third or fourth degree.
10	(2) Computer fraud in the third degree is a class C
11	felony."
12	SECTION 2. Section 708-890, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by adding six new definitions to be appropriately
14	inserted and to read as follows:
15	"Authorized user" means, with regards to a computer, the

- 10 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.

Adds new definitions to computer crime. Creates a third degree of computer fraud, and incorporates the element of phishing and spyware into all computer fraud offenses and unauthorized computer access offenses. Effective January 7, 2059. (HB1788 HD1)
