### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ABSENTEE VOTING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 3 (e) A covered voter may apply for registration and an
- 4 absentee ballot by electronic transmission, if otherwise

- 7 to the voter by electronic transmission may choose facsimile
