BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 88-74, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:

3 " (g) If a member, who becomes a member after June 30,

4 2012, has credited service as a judge, the member's retirement

5 allowance shall be computed on the following basis:

> (1) For each year of credited service as a judge, three per cent of the member's average final compensation in addition to an annuity that is the actuarial equivalent of the member's accumulated contributions allocable to the period of service. If the member has not attained age sixty, the member's retirement allowance shall be computed as though the member had attained age sixty, reduced for age as provided in subsection (i); and

(2) For a judge with other credited service, as provided in subsection (f). If the member has not attained age sixty, the member's retirement allowance shall be

computed as though the member had attained age sixty,
