A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that for farmers and
- 2 ranchers to remain competitive and self-sustaining, the State
- 3 must provide incentives and mechanisms to ensure that all means
- 4 of supporting the local agriculture industry are implemented.
- 5 The public utilities commission regulates the rates charged for
- 6 public utilities that provide essential services to the
- 7 agriculture industry such as water, interisland shipping, and
- 8 electricity.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to provide for preferential
- 10 rates for public utility services provided to ratepayers engaged
- 11 in agricultural activities on land within an agricultural
- 12 district.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 269-26.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] \$269-26.5[+] Preferential [water] public utility rates
- 16 for agricultural activities. (a) It is the policy of the State
- 17 to promote the long-term viability of agriculture by
- 18 establishing mechanisms that provide for preferential rates for



- 1 [potable water for] public utility services that are provided to
- 2 ratepayers that engage in agricultural activities [-] on land
- 3 within agricultural districts. The public utilities commission
- 4 shall have the authority to establish preferential rates for
- 5 [potable water] public utility services that are used by
- 6 ratepayers for agricultural activities on land within
- 7 agricultural districts in a public utility's service area.
- 8 (b) Upon receipt of a bona fide request for preferential
- 9 rates for [potable water] any public utility service to be used
- 10 for agricultural activities[7] on lands within an agricultural
- 11 district, and proof that the customer engages in agricultural
- 12 activities[7] on lands within an agricultural district, a public
- 13 utility [shall] may provide proposed preferential rates for
- 14 [potable water] the requested public utility service, including
- 15 but not limited to potable water, electricity, and freight
- 16 transport, to be used only for qualified agricultural activities
- 17 subject to the public utilities commission for approval. All
- 18 such rates approved by the public utilities commission shall be
- 19 subsidized by the [potable water] rates charged to other
- 20 customers of the public utility, if required, as determined by
- 21 the public utilities commission. In reviewing the proposed
- 22 preferential rates, the public utilities commission, in



- 1 consultation with the department of agriculture, may establish
- 2 additional criteria to qualify bona fide agribusinesses for
- 3 [water] public utility services used solely for agricultural
- 4 activities[. For rate cases initiated pursuant to this section,
- 5 the public utilities commission shall allow the recovery of any
- 6 reasonable unamortized costs incurred by the public utility in
- 7 its previous rate case; provided however, upon full amortization
- 8 of these costs, rates shall be adjusted accordingly.] on lands
- 9 within an agricultural district."
- 10 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
