A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 431:10A-126, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
 2 is amended to read as follows:
 3 "[+]\$431:10A-126[+] Chemotherapy services. (a)
- 4 Notwithstanding section 23-51, all individual and group accident
- 5 and health or sickness insurance policies that include coverage
- ${f 6}$ or benefits for the treatment of cancer shall provide payment or
- 7 reimbursement for all chemotherapy that is considered medically
- ${f 8}$ necessary as defined in section 432E-1.4, including [orally
- 9 administered] nongeneric oral chemotherapy, [at the same
- 10 copayment percentage or relative coinsurance amount as is
- 11 applied to intravenously administered chemotherapy;] with a
- 12 percentage cost share that is equal to the percentage cost share
- 13 for nongeneric orally administered cancer medications or the
- 14 percentage cost share for nongeneric intravenous or injected
- 15 cancer medications, whichever is lower; provided that this
- 16 section shall not apply to an accident only, specified disease,
- 17 hospital indemnity, long-term care, or other limited benefit
- 18 health insurance policy. <u>Individual and group accident and</u>



- 1 health or sickness insurance policies shall not increase
- 2 enrollee cost sharing for nongeneric cancer medications to any
- 3 greater extent than the policy increases enrollee cost sharing
- 4 for other nongeneric covered medication.
- 5 (b) For the purposes of this section:
- 6 "Cost share" or "cost sharing" means copayment,
- 7 coinsurance, or deductible provisions applicable to coverage for
- 8 oral, intravenous, or injected nongeneric cancer medications.
- 9 ["Intravenously-administered chemotherapy"] "Intravenous or
- 10 injected cancer medication" means a physician-prescribed cancer
- 11 treatment that is administered through injection directly into
- 12 the patient's circulatory system by a physician, physician
- 13 assistant, nurse practitioner, nurse, or other medical personnel
- 14 under the supervision of a physician and in a hospital, medical
- 15 office, or other clinical setting.
- 16 "Oral chemotherapy" means a United States Food and Drug
- 17 Administration-approved, physician-prescribed cancer treatment
- 18 that is taken orally in the form of a tablet or capsule and may
- 19 be administered in a hospital, medical office, or other clinical
- 20 setting or may be delivered to the patient for self-
- 21 administration under the direction or supervision of a physician

1 outside of a hospital, medical office, or other clinical 2 setting." 3 SECTION 2. Section 432:1-616, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "[+]5432:1-616[+] Chemotherapy services. (a) A11 6 individual and group hospital and medical service plan contracts 7 that include coverage or benefits for the treatment of cancer 8 shall provide payment or reimbursement for all chemotherapy that 9 is considered medically necessary as defined in section 432E-10 1.4, including [orally administered] nongeneric oral 11 chemotherapy, [at the same copayment percentage or relative 12 coinsurance amount as is applied to intravenously administered 13 chemotherapy;] with a percentage cost share that is equal to the 14 percentage cost share for nongeneric orally administered cancer 15 medications or the percentage cost share for nongeneric 16 intravenous or injected cancer medications, whichever is lower; 17 provided that this section shall not apply to an accident only, 18 specified disease, hospital indemnity, long-term care, or other limited benefit health insurance policy. Individual and group 19 20 hospital and medical service plan contracts shall not increase

enrollee cost sharing for nongeneric cancer medications to any

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- 1 greater extent than the contract increases enrollee cost sharing
- 2 for other nongeneric covered medication.
- 3 (b) For the purposes of this section:
