BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 431:10A-126, Hawaii Revised Statutes,

"Intravenously administered chemotherapy" means a 12 physician-prescribed cancer treatment that is administered 13 through injection directly into the patient's circulatory system 14 by a physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, nurse, 15 or other medical personnel under the supervision of a physician 16 and in a hospital, medical office, or other clinical setting. **17** "Oral chemotherapy" means a United States Food and Drug 18 Administration-approved, physician-prescribed cancer treatment 19 that is taken orally in the form of a tablet or capsule and may 20

setting or may be delivered to the patient for self-
