RELATING TO LABOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 371, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§371- National Human Trafficking Resource Center hotline;
5	posting requirement; penalty. (a) An establishment, as defined
6	in this section, shall post in a conspicuous place near the
7	entrance to, or other area where, posters and notices are
8	customarily posted on the premises of the establishment, a
9	poster of no smaller than eight and one-half inches by eleven
10	inches in size that states the following:
11	"If you or someone you know is being forced to engage in
12	any activity and cannot leave - whether it is commercial
13	sex, housework, farm work, or any other activity - call the
14	National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline at 1-
15	888-373-7888 to access help and services.
16	Victims of human trafficking are protected under U.S. and
17	Hawaii law.
