A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that modernization and 2 improvements at Hawaii's airports concessions have not kept pace 3 with passenger needs and demands. A recent study by the State 4 indicates that various areas at our public airports are lacking 5 in concession space by as much as forty per cent. In addition 6 to areas covered by this study, the legislature expresses the 7 need for the department of transportation to conduct a similar 8 assessment of other areas at our public airports. 9 The recent study also indicates that Hawaii's public

airports are not maximizing revenues they could be receiving if
additional concession spaces and other related improvements were
made. These improvements reportedly would not only pay for
themselves but would also generate additional revenues for
Hawaii's public airports, provide critically-needed jobs, and
stimulate Hawaii's economy.

In light of these benefits, the legislature finds that the department of transportation must fast-track the implementation of these improvements. The legislature will consider and HB2004 HD2 HMS 2012-2331

- 1 support the department of transportation's requests to meet
- 2 these goals.
- 3 While the legislature recognizes the importance of fast-
- 4 tracking such improvements, it also recognizes that fast-paced
- 5 construction and related matters will result in hardship to
- 6 existing airport concessions, including inconveniences such as
- 7 temporary barricades, re-routing of passengers, and temporary
- 8 relocation of concession operations, among other issues. In
- 9 addition, the legislature recognizes the financial hardships
- 10 existing concessions will face when asked by the department of
- 11 transportation to make and pay for improvements such as newly-
- 12 added concession spaces or improved fixtures, lighting,
- 13 flooring, partitioning, and equipment, among other expenditures.
- 14 Further, the legislature recognizes that concessions may not be
- 15 able to afford these improvements for various reasons. In a
- 16 typical scenario, a concession may not be able to recoup the
- 17 money it paid for improvements because the existing or remaining
- 18 term of its lease or permit is too short.
- 19 Thus, the legislature finds that it is important for the
- 20 department of transportation and concessions to work together to
- 21 achieve the improvements contemplated by this Act in an
- 22 expeditious but fair and equitable manner, including amendments



- 1 extending the term of a concession lease or permit at the
- 2 department of transportation's discretion. Since such
- 3 amendments or changes cannot simply be granted by the department
- 4 of transportation, legislative direction and authorization are
- 5 necessary.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to provide the department of
- 7 transportation with the authority and discretion to reach an
- 8 agreement with an airport concession to extend the term of the
- 9 concession and to modify and amend terms of any concession
- 10 contract, lease, or permit in exchange for revenue-enhancing
- 11 improvements that are made or paid for by the concession.
- 12 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any laws or provisions to the
- 13 contrary, including but not limited to chapters 102 and 261,
- 14 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the department of transportation, in
- 15 its sole discretion and authority, upon mutual agreement with a
- 16 concession and in exchange for revenue-enhancing improvements
- 17 that are made or paid by a concession and deemed acceptable by
- 18 the department of transportation, may extend, modify, alter, or
- 19 amend the terms of concession contracts, leases, and permits.
- 20 SECTION 3. The authority provided to the department of
- 21 transportation by this Act shall remain valid as long as and to
- 22 the extent that such authority does not violate any applicable

- 1 federal laws and regulations and does not jeopardize the receipt
- 2 of federal aid or impair the obligation of the department of
- 3 transportation to the holders of any bond issued by the
- 4 department of transportation.
- 5 SECTION 4. To the extent necessary to take action,
- 6 effectuate, and fulfill the purpose and intentions of this Act,
- 7 including the authority provided, section 171-13 and chapters
- 8 102 and 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as well as any other
- 9 statutory provisions or rules that may be in conflict with this
- 10 Act, shall be deemed waived and not applicable.
- 11 SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 12 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 13 invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or
- 14 applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the
- 15 invalid provisions or application, and to this end the
- 16 provisions of this Act are severable.
- 17 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030, and
- 18 shall be repealed on July 1, 2014.

Description:

Temporarily authorizes the Department of Transportation to extend the term of an airport concession, and to modify and amend the terms of any concession contract, lease, or permit in exchange for revenue-enhancing improvements that are made or paid for by the concession. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB2004 HD2)
