A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that persons have engaged
2	in defrauding tourists by purporting to pick them up in vehicles
3	at popular Waikiki tourist venues and taking them to various
4	tourist sightseeing locations or activities, or transporting
5	them to other business locations. Typically a tourist is picked
6	up shortly ahead of scheduled pickups by a bona fide taxi or
7	tour operator. The tourist at times pays up to twice the amount
8	of travel fare and is sometimes promised refunds that are never
9	received. To make matters worse, some tourists are never picked
10	up for the return trip and are left stranded without
11	transportation back to their lodging accommodation.
12	The legislature further finds that this type of
13	unscrupulous activity by unconscionable people who would prey on
14	tourists casts a bad image on Hawaii and may lead to a downturn
15	in the economy. The legislature also finds that unscrupulous
16	and deceptive activities are conducted by drivers who are not
17	properly certified or licensed and drive vehicles that typically

fail to meet the public utilities commission's requirements and 1 2 other requirements. 3 The purpose of this Act is to create a criminal offense of 4 deception of a visitor in transportation services for hire. 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately 6 7 designated and to read as follows: 8 "§708- Deception of a visitor in transportation services 9 for hire. (1) A person commits the offense of deception of a 10 visitor in transportation services for hire, if the person for a charge or other sort of compensation transports a visitor in a 11 12 vehicle that does not meet the definition of a bona fide 13 transportation service. 14 (2) As used in this section: "Bona fide transportation service" means a vehicle that 15 16 meets the following requirements: 17 (a) The vehicle is not a licensed taxi cab even though the vehicle may be registered with the public utilities 18 19 commission;

The vehicle has a numbered "PUC" number and vehicle

number displayed on the rear-side of the vehicle;

15	(3)	Deception of a visitor in transportation services for
16	hire is a	misdemeanor.
17	(4)	In addition to any other penalties provided by law,
18	the vehic	le used in the commission of the offense of deception
19	of a visi	tor in transportation services for hire shall be:
20	<u>(a)</u>	Impounded and the vehicle owner shall be liable for
21		impoundment costs of storage, towing, and other

1		charges incident to seizure of the vehicle or any
2		other cost involved; or
3	<u>(b)</u>	Subject to forfeiture under chapter 712A if the
4		vehicle used in the instant offense was used in a
5		previous offense under this section within the thirty-
6		six months immediately preceding the instant offense.
7	SECT	ION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
8	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9	begun bef	ore its effective date.
10	SECT	ION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
