A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 383, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by adding a new section to part VII to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 "§383- Self-employment assistance; eligibility; amounts 5 payable; rules. (a) An individual identified under department rules as likely to exhaust regular benefits before finding 6 7 employment may receive the self-employment assistance allowance pursuant to this section in lieu of regular benefits. Self-8 9 employment assistance allowance amounts shall be paid from the 10 fund. 11 The weekly amount of the self-employment assistance 12 allowance payable to an individual shall be equal to the weekly 13 benefit amount under section 383-22. The sum of the self-14 employment assistance allowance and the regular benefits paid 15 under this chapter with respect to any benefit year shall not 16 exceed the maximum benefit amount payable under section 383-24

with respect to that benefit year.

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1	<u>(c)</u>	The self-employment assistance allowance shall be
2	payable t	o an individual at the same intervals and on the same
3	terms and	conditions as regular benefits; provided that:
4	(1)	Any provision of this chapter regarding being
5		available for work, actively seeking work, or refusing
6		to accept suitable work shall not apply to the
7		individual;
8	(2)	Any provision of this chapter reducing the amount of
9		benefits due to remuneration for services performed
10		during a period of employment shall not apply to
11		income earned from self-employment by the individual;
12	(3)	An individual participating in self-employment
13		assistance activities shall be considered to be
14		unemployed; and
15	(4)	An individual who fails to participate in self-
16		employment assistance activities or who fails actively
17		to engage on a full-time basis in establishing a
18		business and becoming self-employed shall be
19		ineligible to receive the self-employment assistance
20		allowance for each week in which the failure occurs.
21	(d)	The number of individuals receiving the self-
22	employmen	t assistance allowance at any time shall not exceed



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- 1 five per cent of the number of individuals receiving regular
- 2 benefits.
- 3 (e) The self-employment assistance allowance shall be
- 4 charged to employers in the manner provided in this chapter for
- 5 the charging of regular benefits.
- 6 (f) The director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
- 7 to implement this section; provided that in adopting rules, the
- 8 director, insofar as practicable, shall comply with rules and
- 9 policies of the United States Department of Labor.
- 10 (g) This section shall be operative upon the enactment of
- 11 federal law authorizing this section or upon the date of any
- 12 required plan adopted by the United States Department of Labor,
- 13 whichever date is later, and shall terminate at the end of the
- 14 week preceding the date when federal law no longer authorizes
- 15 this section, unless that date is on a Saturday, in which case
- 16 the authority terminates on that date.
- 17 (h) For the purposes of this section:
- 18 "Self-employment assistance activities" means activities
- 19 approved by the director and designed to enable participating
- 20 individuals to establish a business and become self-employed.
- 21 "Self-employment assistance activities" includes entrepreneurial
- 22 training, business counseling, and technical assistance.



1	"Self-employment assistance allowance" means an amount
2	payable to an individual participating in self-employment
3	assistance activities in accordance with this section."
4	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
5	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
