A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) There is established, within the
- 2 department of labor and industrial relations, a temporary
- 3 program to be known as the self-employment assistance program.
- 4 The self-employment assistance program shall be developed by the
- 5 department of labor and industrial relations and approved by the
- 6 director of labor and industrial relations.
- 7 (b) The self-employment assistance program shall include,
- 8 but not be limited to, entrepreneurial training, business
- 9 counseling, technical assistance, and requirements for
- 10 participants to engage in activities relating to the
- 11 establishment of a business and becoming self-employed.
- 12 (c) An unemployed individual shall be eligible to
- 13 participate in the self-employment assistance program if it has
- 14 been determined by the department of labor and industrial
- 15 relations that the unemployed individual meets the following
- 16 qualifications:

1	(1)	The unemproyed individual is eligible to receive
2		unemployment benefits under chapter 383, Hawaii
3		Revised Statutes; and
4	(2)	The unemployed individual has been identified as
5		likely to exhaust unemployment benefits before finding
6		employment.
7	(d)	The department of labor and industrial relations shall
8	identify,	under rules adopted by the department pursuant to
9	chapter 9	1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, unemployed individuals that
10	are likel	y to exhaust regular benefits before finding employment
11	and shall	notify the identified unemployed individuals of the
12	opportuni	ty to enroll in the self-employment assistance program.
13	(e)	Unemployed individuals participating in the self-
14	employmen	t assistance program shall be eligible to receive
15	benefits	under the federal Emergency Unemployment Compensation
16	Program;	provided that:
17	(1)	The requirements of chapter 383, Hawaii Revised
18		Statutes, regarding being available for work, actively
19		seeking work, or refusing to accept suitable work
20		shall not apply to the unemployed individual; and

1	(2)	An unemployed individual participating in self-	
2		employment assistance activities shall be considered	
3		to be unemployed.	
4	(f)	An unemployed individual participating in the self-	
5	employment	assistance program who fails to participate in self-	
6	employment	assistance activities or who fails, on a full-time	
7	basis, to	actively engage in establishing a business and	
8	becoming s	elf-employed shall be disqualified from participating	
9	in the sel	f-employment assistance program.	
10	(g)	The director of labor and industrial relations shall	
11	take all s	teps necessary to carry out the purposes of the self-	
12	employment assistance program to assure collaborative		
13	involvement of interested parties in the development of the		
14	self-employment assistance program, and to ensure that the self-		
15	employment assistance programs meet all federal criteria for		
16	withdrawal	under the federal Emergency Unemployment Compensation	
17	Program. T	he director of labor and industrial relations may	
18	approve, a	s self-employment assistance programs, existing self-	
19	employment	training programs available through community	
20	colleges,	workforce investment boards, or other organizations

- 1 funding is provided to the department of labor and industrial
- 2 relations for that purpose through federal or state
- 3 appropriations.
- 4 (h) An unemployed individual completing the self-
- 5 employment assistance program may not directly compete with the
- 6 unemployed individual's separating employer for a specific time
- 7 period and in a specific geographic area as determined by the
- 8 director of labor and industrial relations. The time period may
- 9 not exceed one year. Both the time period and the geographic
- 10 area must be reasonable, considering whether:
- 11 (1) Restraining the unemployed individual from performing
- services is necessary for the protection of the
- employer or the employer's goodwill;
- 14 (2) The agreement harms the unemployed individual more
- than is reasonably necessary to secure the employer's
- business or goodwill; and
- 17 (3) The loss of the unemployed individual's services and
- skills injures the public to a degree warranting
- nonenforcement of the agreement.
- 20 (i) The director of labor and industrial relations shall
- 21 adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91, Hawaii Revised

- 1 Statutes, to implement and carry out the purposes of the self-
- 2 employment assistance program.
- 3 (j) As used in this Act, the term "unemployed individual"
- 4 shall have the same meaning as used in Chapter 383, Hawaii
- 5 Revised Statutes.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2049,
- 7 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2015.
