A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

 and to read as follows:

 Lost or stolen firearms; reporting requirement.
- 5 (a) Any owner or other person in lawful possession of a
- 6 firearm, upon discovering that the firearm has been lost or
- 7 stolen, shall report the loss or theft within seventy-two hours
- 8. of the discovery to the chief of police of the county in which
- 9 the loss or theft occurred and, if different, the county in
- 10 which the firearm is registered.
- (b) Any person who violates this section shall be guilty
- 12 of a misdemeanor.
- 13 (c) A person shall be exempt from the penalties specified
- 14 in section 134-17, sections 134-23 to 134-27, and section 707-
- 15 714.5 with regard to any firearm the person reports as lost or
- 16 stolen pursuant to this section."
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 134-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
