The penalty provided in this section 9 shall be cumulative to the remedies and penalties available 10 under all other laws of this State." 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 487J, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended by amending the title to read as follows: 13 "CHAPTER 487J 14 [SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER] PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION" SECTION 3.
