17	[(b)] <u>(c)</u> No property shall be forfeited under this chapter to

4	[(c)] <u>(d)</u>	No conveyance used by any person as a common carrier
5		in the transaction of a business as a common carrier

7		appears that the owner or other person in charge of
8		the conveyance is a consenting party or privy to a
9		violation of this chapter;
10	[(d)] <u>(e)</u>	No conveyance is subject to forfeiture under this
11		section by reason of any act or omission established
12		by the owner thereof to have been committed or omitted
13		without the owner's knowledge or consent; and
14	[(e)] <u>(f)</u>	A forfeiture of a conveyance encumbered by a bona fide
15		security interest is subject to the interest of the
16		secured party if the secured party neither had
17		knowledge of nor consented to the act or omission."
