# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	STRENGTHENING FAMILIES OF INCARCERATED PERSONS
3	SECTION 1. The department of public safety is in the
4	process of developing a system to identify children of
5	incarcerated parents, develop programs and support services for
6	those children, provide appropriate support for incarcerated
7	parents, and develop programs to strengthen the well-being of
8	those families. The legislature finds that it is crucial to the
9	rehabilitation process that families of incarcerated persons
l0	have sufficient security and are in a comfortable state. Strong
<b>l1</b>	families and family ties, particularly with regard to children
12	of incarcerated persons, provide a level of hope and normalcy in
13	life to the inmate.
14	The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds for
15	programs to strengthen the well-being of families of
16	incarcerated persons and help children of incarcerated persons.
17	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
18	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

- programs to strengthen the well-being of families of

- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 public safety for the purposes of this part.
- 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for
- 9 programs to help children of incarcerated persons.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 11 public safety for the purposes of this part.
- 12 PART II
- 13 RESTORATIVE CIRCLES PROGRAM
- 14 SECTION 4. The legislature finds that restorative circles
- 15 is based on restorative justice, which is an approach to justice
- 16 that focuses on the needs of victims, offenders, and the
- 17 community. Victims take an active role in the process, and
- 18 offenders are encouraged to take responsibility for their
- 19 actions by making an apology to the victims and expressing
- 20 remorse for the offender's misdeeds. The process involves the
- 21 collaboration of victim and offender in a voluntary, mutual, and
- 22 supportive verbal interaction to heal wounds. The process also



- 1 provides help for the offender to avoid future offenses.
- 2 Restorative circles implements the theory of justice that crime
- 3 is a wrongdoing against the victim and the community, rather
- 4 than solely on the State.
- 5 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds for the
- 6 restorative circles program.
- 7 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for
- 10 the restorative circles program.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 public safety for the purposes of this part.
- 13 PART III
- 14 GOING HOME PROGRAM
- 15 SECTION 6. The legislature finds that the Hawaii county
- 16 workforce investment board provides a comprehensive prison-to-
- 17 community reentry program for incarcerated persons on the island
- 18 of Hawaii. The reentry program, known as "going home", is part
- 19 of Hawaii county's labor force pool expansion. The Hawaii
- 20 Island Workforce and Economic Development Ohana, Inc., is the
- 21 coordinating entity for the going home program, which promotes
- 22 the development of a highly competent and productive workforce



- by coordinating the efforts of educational institutions, labor,
  business, economic development organizations, and the entire
- 3 community to sustain a vibrant Big Island economy and lifestyle.
- 4 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds as a
- 5 grant-in-aid for funding the going home program.
- 6 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 as a grant
- 9 pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to Hawaii
- 10 county to provide funding for the going home program provided
- 11 through the Hawaii county workforce investment board.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of
- 13 Hawaii for the purposes of this part.
- 14 PART IV
- 15 BEING EMPOWERED AND SAFE TOGETHER PROGRAM
- 16 SECTION 8. The legislature finds that the "being empowered
- 17 and safe together" program administered by Maui Economic
- 18 Opportunity, Inc., in collaboration with the department of
- 19 public safety, serves individuals who are preparing to return to
- 20 the community from Maui community correctional center. The
- 21 program provides comprehensive transitional assistance to
- 22 inmates and ex-inmates, with the goals of reducing recidivism



- 1 and increasing public safety. The typical individual served has
- 2 been convicted of serious and violent offenses and incarcerated
- 3 for over a year.
- 4 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds as a
- 5 grant-in-aid to fund the being empowered and safe together
- 6 program and other programs of Maui Economic Opportunity, Inc.
- 7 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 as a
- 10 grant pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to Maui
- 11 county to provide funding for the being empowered and safe
- 12 together program or other programs administered by Maui Economic
- 13 Opportunity, Inc., for inmates and ex-inmates.
- 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of
- 15 Maui for the purposes of this part.
- 16 PART V
- 17 BUILDING JOB SKILLS
- 18 SECTION 10. The legislature finds that the department of
- 19 public safety provides programs to teach inmates transferable
- 20 job skills and a positive work ethic to help prepare them for
- 21 post-release, reentry, and employment in the community. The
- 22 goal of these programs, usually provided through the



- 1 correctional industries division, is to return an economically
- 2 self-sufficient individual to the community who will be able to
- 3 immediately join the workforce and become a productive, law
- 4 abiding member of society.
- 5 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds for
- 6 building job skills of inmates.
- 7 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for
- 10 building job skills of inmates, particularly those who are soon
- 11 to be paroled.
- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 13 public safety for the purposes of this part.
- 14 PART VI
- NO LOOKING BACK PROGRAM
- 16 SECTION 12. The legislature finds that the "no looking
- 17 back program" assists incarcerated men to successfully
- 18 transition back into the community through mentorship. This
- 19 voluntary mentorship program is based on the "each one, teach
- 20 one" philosophy that begins while the offender is incarcerated
- 21 and is transitioned back into the community. Program
- 22 participants are educated on the principles of success, starting

- 1 with the setting of clear and manageable tasks, the learning of
- 2 basic skills such as time management and budget planning, the
- 3 discarding of unproductive habits, and the nurturing of new
- 4 patterns of behavior, and ending with the making of changes to
- 5 help them achieve their goals.
- 6 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds as a grant
- 7 pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to fund the no
- 8 looking back program.
- 9 SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 as a
- 12 grant pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to the
- 13 Golden Castle Foundation to provide, funding for the no looking
- 14 back program.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 16 public safety for the purposes of this part.
- 17 SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
