## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

	DE II ENACTED DI THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.		
1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that recent budgetary		
2	reductions to the medicaid QUEST health care program will resul		
3	in fewer persons being eligible for benefits due to the change		
4	in applicable income limits, which have been reduced from the		
5	existing income limit of below two hundred per cent of the		
6	federal poverty level to the new income limit of below one		
7	hundred thirty-three per cent of the federal poverty level. The		
8	change in program eligibility requirements will result in		
9	disenrollment of approximately four thousand five hundred adults		
10	from QUEST, making them uninsured.		
11	The legislature further finds that twenty-seven per cent of		
12	individuals at community health centers, or thirty-five thousand		
13	individuals, are currently uninsured. In addition, eighty-five		
14	per cent of community health center patients have incomes below		
15	two hundred per cent of the federal poverty level, and		
16	approximately half of the total patients seen by community		
17	health centers are current medicaid enrollees. The legislature

- 1 disproportionately affect community health centers because of
- 2 their patient demographics. The vast majority of newly
- 3 uninsured health care consumers who will be cut from the OUEST
- 4 program will either turn to community health centers for their
- 5 care or seek out hospital emergency department care, which
- 6 reports show is seven times more costly to the State than
- 7 providing basic coverage.
- 8 Community health centers serve uninsured individuals, low-
- 9 income patient populations with demographic complexities and co-
- 10 morbidities, medicaid members, the homeless, and privately
- 11 insured individuals and families. Community health centers:
- 12 (1) Are nonprofit, community-based organizations whose
- purpose and expertise are to provide quality person
- 14 centered health care to underserved populations and
- regions;
- 16 (2) Provide culturally and linguistically appropriate
- 17 health care including a broad range of primary care
- and preventive services;
- 19 (3) Are located in medically-underserved areas where
- 20 individuals have limited access to other health care
- 21 providers because of geographic and socio-economic
- 22 barriers;

1	(4)	Contribute greatly to the economies and livability of	
2		the communities they serve; and	
3	(5)	Are cost-effective providers whose care results in	
4		healthier patients and decreased use of emergency,	
5		specialty, and in-patient services.	
6	By helping avoid unnecessary emergency room, in-patient,		
7	and specia	alty use, community health centers save the health care	
8	system \$1,	262 per year per patient. In 2009, community health	
9	centers in	Hawaii saved the State more than \$160,000,000, an	
10	even greater savings than the \$128,000,000 realized in 2008.		
11	Community health centers are a smart investment that results in		
12	healthier communities while saving the state money.		
13	Altho	ugh the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act,	
14	P.L. 111-4	8, expands the population that will be eligible for	
15	medicaid c	overage and private insurance, those provisions will	
16	not take e	ffect until 2014, leaving uncertainty for many,	
17	including	the increased numbers of uninsured individuals, as	
18	Hawaii's e	conomy continues to struggle. Furthermore, as seen in	
19	Massachuse	tts, following implementation of that state's landmark	
20	health ref	orm law, community health centers may see an increase	
21	in the num	ber and proportion of the state's uninsured that are	

- 1 treated at their facilities after the federal law becomes
- 2 effective.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to provide funding for quality,
- 4 cost-effective health care for Hawaii's uninsured.
- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,500,000 or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 to carry
- 8 out the purposes of this Act, including the provision of primary
- 9 medical, dental, and behavioral health care for uninsured
- 10 persons through nonprofit community health centers; provided
- 11 that distribution of funds by the department of health may be on
- 12 a per-visit basis, and may include a per-member per-month
- 13 quality incentive payment, taking into consideration the need on
- 14 all islands.
- 15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 16 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
